Ephesians 1:15-17 PAUL'S PRAYER FOR THE EPHESIAN SAINTS

- I. For whom he prayed.
 - A. The Ephesian Christians are saints and faithful (1); blessed with all spiritual blessings (3); chosen to be holy (4).
 - B. About these Ephesians Paul says he "heard" two good things which are the acid tests of genuine salvation.
 - 1. The first and essential test is their "faith in the Lord Jesus."
 - 2. Secondly, it is their "love unto all the saints" which love (God and fellow-saints) flows from faith (I Peter 1:22; I John).
- II. For what Paul prays for the Ephesians saints.
 - A. The first thing mentioned in his prayer for them is that Paul gives thanks for them, and does so ceaselessly.
 - B. Paul asks for "the Spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him" (God our Father) God-centered!
 - 1. That which is most essential and necessary and precious is the knowledge of God and of Jesus (John 17:3).
 - 2. "Knowledge" is a strong, powerful term referring to precise and correct intellectual grasp of things ethical and divine.
 - 3. The "eyes of your understanding (heart) being enlightened," i.e., given spiritual perception.
 - 4. The eyes of our heart are enlightened by the "Spirit of wisdom and revelation."
- III. To whom does Paul pray? "the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory."
 - A. Knowing the One to whom he is making this request explains why he knows that his request will be answered.
 - B. He is the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, i.e., Jesus' God is our God (John 20:17).
 - C. And He is the "Father of glory."
