"Why Not Works?" Romans 4:1-8

Introduction: The Most Common Method: 1. - Of "Salvation" Today: - In All The World: - Is Based On Works! - For The Religious: - A Person's Works: - Are What Works: - To Be Right With Their God! Or Their Gods! - We See This In: - Ancient Religions - Like The Different Religions: - We Find In The Bible! - Where Each Nation Had Their Own Gods And Were Required To Offer Sacrifices: - To Both Appease & To Please Them! - We Also See This In: - More Recent Religions - Like The Religion: - Of Islam - Because Muslims Have: - Their "Five Pillars" Which They Are To Follow: - In Order To Make It To Paradise! - For Them - Good Works Are What Works: - To Be Right With God! - But - Even For The Non-Religious: - This Seems To Be The Case! - Because - For Most People: - Just Being Good Or Doing Good: - Is Enough To Be Right With God: - If A God Exists! But - As We See In The Gospel: 2. - Good Works Won't Work - And: - Good Works *Can't* Work: - To Justify Us Before God - Because: - 3:10 - "There is none righteous, no, not one!" - And - If Good Works *Did* Work: - Only A Perfect Righteousness: - Would Be Acceptable To: - A Perfectly Righteous God! So - In The Verses We Come To This Morning: 3. - In The Book Of Romans: - The Apostle Paul Gives Us Three Reasons: - Why Salvation: - Is Not & Can-Not Be: - Based On Our Works! - So - Please Turn With Me In Your Bibles: - To Romans 4 - Where We Are Introduced: - For The First Time In This Book: - To Abraham - Who Is Seen By Paul: - As Proof That Salvation & Justification Is By Faith Alone: - And Not By Works! - Paul Looks At Abraham: - Because - To The Jews Especially: - Abraham Was Considered To Be: - Perfectly Righteous!

- They Would Point To Verses Like Genesis 26:5 - Where God Himself Said That "Abraham obeyed my voice, and kept my charge, my commandments, my statutes, and my laws!"

- Many Jews Believe That:

- Abraham Was *So* Righteous That:

- He Kept God's Law Even Before:

- God Gave Them His Law:

- And That He Never Had Any Reason To Repent!

4. So - Paul Deals With This:

- In 4:1-8 - Because - If It Can Be Proven:

- That Good Works Don't Work:

- For Someone Like Abraham:

- Then - Good Works Won't Work:

- For Anyone - Like You & Like Me!

5. So - Beginning In 4:1:

- Paul Asks:

- "What shall we say then that Abraham our father, as pertaining to the flesh, hath found?"

- Here - Paul Appeals To:

- The Prime Ancestor Of The Jews!

- Not Only Did They Consider Him:

- To Be Perfectly Righteous!

- They Also Believed Their Connection To Abraham Was All That Was Necessary:

- To Be Right With God!

- In John 8:33 - The Jews Reminded Jesus That:

- "We be Abraham's seed, and were never in bondage to any man!"

6. So - Paul Appeals To:

- The Prime Authority Of The Jews As Well - And Asks:

- "What Did Abraham Find / Discover?"

- IE: To Discover Something - Doesn't Mean That You've Found Something Entirely New - Just That - It Is New To You! When We Say That Columbus Or Any Other Explorer "Discovered" A New Place - Or Even - That A Scientist "Discovers" A New Species - It Only Means That It Was New To Them! It Truth, It Was There All Along!

- This Is True About:

- Salvation & Justification By Faith:

- As Well!

- Abraham Himself Discovered / Found Out That His Own Flesh & His Own Works:

- Had Absolutely Nothing To Do With His Standing With God!

- So - Why Not Works?

* Because - First - When You Rely On Your Own Works - It Robs Your Salvation:

Of God's Glory!

1.

- Which Is What We Find In:

- 4:2-3 - "For if Abraham were justified by works, he hath whereof to glory; but not before God. / For what saith the scripture? Abraham believed God, and it was counted unto him for righteousness!"

- The Bible Is Clear That:

- Abraham Was A Justified Man!

- Justified By God & Justified Before God!

- Everyone Would Agree To This!

- But - If His Right Standing With God:

- Was Based On His Works:

- Then - He Would Have Something To Boast About:

- As The Reason For His Relationship With God!

- Something In Himself!

- Something In His Flesh!

- But - Paul Has Already Established:

- In 3:27 - That Boasting Is Excluded!

- "Where is boasting then?" - Paul Asked - "It is excluded. By what law? of works? Nay:

but by the law of faith!"

- You See - Salvation & Justification:

- Is A Matter Of:

- God's Glory - Not Man's!

- If You Have Something To Boast About - Then You Get The Credit & The

Glory:

- And Not God!

- So - Even If Abraham Had:

- Something To Boast About & Glory In:

- God Is Unimpressed!

- Because - As It Says In 4:2:

- "But Not Before God!"

- Good Works - Not Even Abraham's:

- Will Impress Or Satisfy:

- God!

- Your Works Can Impress:

- And Sway Man:

- But They Can Never:

- Impress Or Sway:

- God!

- But - Not Only That:

- When It Comes To Being "Justified By Works":

- It Is [Also] Unscriptural!

- Because Of What The Scripture Tells Us!

- And In 4:3 - Paul Quotes A Verse That Would Have Been Very Familiar To The Jews:

- Genesis 15:6 - "Abraham believed God, and it was counted unto him for righteousness!"

- Now - Paul Picked This Verse On Purpose:

- Because This Verse Was Used By The Jews:

- As Proof That Abraham Was Justified By His Works!

- They Even Include His Faith As One Of His Works!

- But - By Using This Verse:

- Paul Shows That They Are Not Only Misinterpreting It - But They Are Also:

- Redefining Faith & Belief!

- Abraham's Faith Was Not A Work That Justified Him!

- Instead - His Faith Was An Acceptance:

- Of God's Work:

- To Justify Him!

- William Newell - "When Abraham Believed God, He Did The One Thing That A Man Can Do Without Doing Anything! There Was No Effort Here! Abraham's Faith Was Not An Act, But An Attitude!"

- He Simply:

- "Believed God!"

- He Believed In The Reality Of God & In The Revelation Of God & In The Reward Of God!

- That God Himself Was His Shield & His Exceeding Great Reward! (Genesis 15:1)

- He Believed In:

- All That God Was & Did & Would Do!

- It Was Also A Faith In The One Whom God Would Send, As The "Seed" Who Would Redeem Him From His Sin!

- We Know This, Because Jesus Himself Said:

- In John 8:56 - "Your father Abraham rejoiced to see my day: and he saw it, and was glad!"

- Abraham Was Justified:

- Because He Trusted In Christ!

- "Abraham Believed God!"

- And What Did God Do?

- "And It Was Counted Unto Him For Righteousness!"

- The Word Translated "Counted" Here:

- Is An Important Word!

- It Means To Impute Or To Reckon Something To An Account!

- It Means That:

- One Thing Is Taken For Something Else!

- IE: Like Using One Form Of Currency Instead Of Another To Buy Something! If You Lent Someone \$1 And Someone Offers You A Chicken Instead - It Is Up To You To Either Accept Or Reject That Offer! But - If You The Chicken - You Have "Imputed" That To Their Account - And Their Debt Has Been Paid!

- So It Is With Us! All Of Us! Abraham Included!

- We All Owe God An Infinite Debt:

- Because Of Our Sin!

- And - A Perfect Righteousness & A Complete Restitution Is Required!

- But - From Us - God Will Accept A Payment Of A Different Sort!

- Faith! Belief!

- In Jesus & *His* Payment:

- On The Cross For Our Sin!

- And - When Abraham Believed:

- And - When You Believe:

- God Will Accept Your Faith As Payment In Full For The Debt That You Owe!

- Because - God Alone Can Set The Terms!

- And Yet - By Keeping His Promises:

- To Abraham & Sending Christ:

- To Pay For His Debt:

- God Remained Both "Just, And The Justifier Of Him Which Believeth In

Jesus!" (3:26)

- And When You Are Justified:

- By Faith:

- The Glory Of God:

- Is Maintained!

* Another Reason Why Salvation Is Not By Works - Is Because - Second - When You Rely On Your Own Works - It Robs Your Salvation:

2. Of God's Grace!

- Which Is What We Find Next In:

- 4:4-5 - "Now to him that worketh is the reward not reckoned of grace, but of debt. / But to him that worketh not, but believeth on him that justifieth the ungodly, his faith is counted for righteousness!"

- So - Not Only Is Your Salvation & Justification:

- A Matter Of God's Glory:

- It Is Also A Matter Or God's Grace!

- Your Salvation Can't Be Based On Your Works:

- Because Of:

- The Nature Of Work [Itself]!

- Verse 4 Gives A General Principle:

- Not Just Of Spiritual Works:

- But - Of Work In General:

- About Which The Bible Has A Lot To Say!

- If You Work:

- You Should Get Paid!

- Put In Terms Of Scripture:

- "The Laborer Is Worthy Of His Hire!"

- And So - Paul Adds:

- The Nature Of Wages!

- When You Work:

- Your "Reward" - Or Pay:

- Is "Not Reckoned Of Grace, But Of Debt!"

- When You Get Paid:

- For The Work You Do:

- It Is An Expectation - Not A Gift!

- IE: Have You Ever Been Mis-Payed! I Have! Not The Right Amount! Not On The Right Day! Different Reasons - But Still Feels Very Unjust!

- Because The Boss Owes You For Your Work Until You Are Paid! - Well - As It Is Naturally: - So It Is Spiritually! - If A Person Is To Work For Their Justification: - Then - By Their Works Will They Be Esteemed! - But - There's One Big Difference! - And That Is - There Is No Debt: - That God Owes To You As A Sinner! - Instead - No Matter How Much You Work: - You Can Never Repay The Debt You Owe To God! - But - That's Where The Gospel Comes In! - Because - In 4:5 - Once Again: - Paul Reiterates - "But to him that worketh not, but believeth on him that justifieth the ungodly, his faith is counted for righteousness!" - God Calls On You & Me: - To Stop Working: - And Start Resting - By Faith: - On The Lord & His Way: - Of Salvation & Justification! - Because - Who Does He Justify? - "The Ungodly!" - This Is How We Are - And: - This Is How We Must Come: - In Order To Be Saved! - Because - Only When You Are Justified: - By Faith: - The Glory & The Grace Of God: - Are Maintained! - And Then - By God's Grace - He Accepts You Even As He Accepted Abraham! * But Then - We Find Another Reason Why Salvation Is Not By Works - And That Is Because - Third - When You Rely On Your Own Works - It Robs Your Salvation: **Of God's Goodness!** - Which Is What We Find In: - 4:6-8 - Where Paul Brings Up What King David Found As Well! - "Even as David also describeth the blessedness of the man, unto whom God imputeth righteousness without works, / Saying, Blessed are they whose iniquities are forgiven, and whose sins are covered. / Blessed is the man to whom the Lord will not impute sin!" - Remember When Paul Asked: - In 4:1 - "What Shall We Say Then?" - Well - After Looking At Abraham: - From Genesis 15 - And: - Now - By Looking At David's Words: - From Psalm 32: - Paul Gives Us An Example Of: - Saying Only: - What The Scripture Says! - This Is Where We Must Go: - For The Answers To The Ouestions That We Have: - About Our Souls & Our Salvation! - As We Are Told In Isaiah 8:20: - "To The Law & To The Testimony!" - It Is God's Word That Will Settle The Matter: - Of Faith & Works! - And So - To The Inspired Words Of King David: - We Turn - Where David Himself: - "Describeth The Blessedness Of The Man Unto Whom God Imputeth Righteousness

3.

Without Works!"

- The Key Word Again Is:

- "Impute!"

- Instead Of God Giving Sinners What They Deserve:

- In His Goodness, He Blesses Them - Entirely Apart From Their

Works!

- How Does God Reveal His Goodness?

- God Releases Us From Our Defiant Condition!

- 4:7 - "Blessed are they whose iniquities are forgiven!"

- The Word Translated "Iniquities" Can Also Be Translated "Lawlessness!"

- It Describes Your Sin As:

- An Utter Contempt & Defiance Of God:

- By Presumptuously Living & Acting Contrary To His Law!

- But - What Does God Do:

- To Those Who Are Defiant & Ungodly?

- He Forgives Us!

- IE: Like Releasing Someone From A Debt They Owe - God Forgives!

- As We Find In Hebrews 10:12:
 - "For I will be merciful to their unrighteousness, and their sins and their iniquities will I remember no more!"

- God Is So Good! But Also:

- God Removes From Us Our Disgraceful Condition!

- 4:7b - "And whose sins are covered!"

- "Sin" Means To "Miss The Mark" Of God & His Glory!
 - It Describes You As Wandering From The Path Of Uprightness & Honor That Belongs To The Lord!

- But - What Does God Do:

- To Those Who Are Disgraceful & Ungodly?

- He Covers Our Sins!

- IE: Not Just In The Old Testament Sense - Of A Covering Over - But By

Blotting Out Something - Never To Brought Up Again!

- As We Find In Psalm 103:11-12:

- "For as the heaven is high above the earth, so great is his mercy toward them that fear him. / As far as the east is from the west, so far hath he removed our transgressions from us!"

- God Is So Good! But Also:

- God Restores Us From Our Depraved Condition!

- 4:8 - "Blessed is the man to whom the Lord will not impute sin!"

- This Is The Fifth Time In These 8 Verses:

- Where We Find That Word "Impute" Or "Reckon" Again!

- And It Means That God Does Not Hold Sin Against Us!

- He Does Not Hold It To Our Account!

- Even As God Did For King Hezekiah:

In Isaiah 38:17 - When He Said - "Behold, for peace I had great bitterness: but thou hast in love to my soul delivered it from the pit of corruption: for thou hast cast all my sins behind thy back!"
God Is So Good!

- And All Of This Goodness:

- God Made Available & Accessible:

- To The Ungodly!

- To Us!
- To Abraham!
- And Even To David!

- Because - As David Fully Understood:

- There Is No Sacrifice - Except One:

- That Can Pay The Debt We Owe!

- No Amount Of Work:

- Ever Can!

- Psalm 51:16-17 - "For thou desirest not sacrifice; else would I give it: thou delightest not in burnt offering. / The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit: a broken and a contrite heart, O God, thou wilt

not despise!"

- And - If God *Does Not*:

- Impute Our Sin & Our Iniquity:

- To Our Account:

- Then - What *Does* He Impute?

- The Opposite!

- Righteousness!

- And - Only When You Are Justified:

- By Faith:

- The Glory & The Grace & The Goodness Of God:

- Are Maintained!

- In These Verses - Paul Quoted David:

- From The First Two Verses Of Psalm 32!

- But - If You Go A Little Further In The Psalm:

- You Find Out How David Received:

- God's Goodness & Blessing!

- In Psalm 32:5 - David Says:

- "I acknowledged my sin unto thee, and mine iniquity have I not hid. I said, I will confess my transgressions unto the LORD; and thou forgavest the iniquity of my sin!"

- So - David Responded To The Lord:

- The Same Way Abraham Did!

- By Faith!

- And - It Too:

- "Was Counted Unto Him For Righteousness!"

Conclusion:

- 1. This Is What Father Abraham Discovered!
 - This Is What King David Discovered!

- And - This Is What We Can / Should Discover As Well!

- Because - Works:

- Will Always Rob Salvation:

- Of God's Glory & God's Grace & God's Goodness!

2. And In Doing So:

- Becomes Our Own Attempt:

- At Salvation - Which Is:

- No Salvation At All!

- But Instead:

- "Blessed is the man to whom the Lord will not impute sin!" - By Faith In Christ Alone!

* Are You Relying On Your Works To Have A Right Relationship With God?

* Or - Do You Have An Attitude Of Faith In God & His Work?

* Are You Enjoying The "Blessedness" Of God's Forgiveness By Faith Alone?
