The Old Covenant Priests were working daily.

The New Covenant Priest work is complete for all days.

The Old Covenant Priests were offered sacrifices continually.

The New Covenant Priest only had to offer one sacrifice.

The sacrifices of the Old Covenant Priests never took away sins.

The sacrifice of the New Covenant Priest did take away sins.

The Old Covenant Priests stood.

The New Covenant Priest is seated.

Why is it such a big deal that Jesus Christ sat and  
the Levitical priest stood?

# Deuteronomy 10:8

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“At that time the LORD set apart the tribe of Levi to carry the ark of the covenant of the LORD to stand before the LORD to minister to him and to bless in his name, to this day.”

Jesus, as the High Priest has taken the perfect sacrifice of Himself into heaven and is there on our behalf.



It is important to know that Christ came from heaven, but it is also important to know that He has returned to Heaven.

Hebrews 1:1-4

There is great comfort in knowing that God the Son, the One who created all things and the One who has the power to uphold the entire universe, is the same One who has made purification for our sins.

Do you ever wonder if your sin is beyond being forgiven?

*Then remind yourself of the position and power of your Savior who sits at the right hand of the Majesty on high.*

Another comfort in knowing that Christ is at the right hand of God is that we can have peace in times of suffering and difficulty.

Hebrews 12:1-3

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Do you ever have difficulties in this life?

Should you be surprised, shocked, or question  
God's faithfulness because of it?



# John 16:33

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“I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world.”

Our peace is in Christ, not in this world. In this world there will be tribulation, but not in the next.

Paul does not look for his suffering on earth to be fully alleviated because he is a Christian, but He knows that one day all suffering will be alleviated because he is a Christian.

Romans 8:31-39

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Another application of Christ being seated, is how it should effect our purpose in this life.

Colossians 3:1-4

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Knowing that Christ has risen causes us to set our hearts and minds on the things of God because we know this life is temporary, and that we will be with Him for all of eternity.

Is your heart and mind occupied with this life?



Revelation 21:1-8

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In summary, the New Covenant believer lives with knowing that:

1. Christ has risen and is reigning at the right hand of God the Father.
2. Christ's complete victory over His enemies is certain.
3. Our hearts and minds have been renewed.
4. The penalty for our sins has been removed.
5. We are forgiven.
