Introduction

We live in a time when what men say cannot be trusted. They are unfaithful

Much of what men say they will do, they usually do not.

Romans 1:31 31 undiscerning, untrustworthy, unloving, unforgiving, unmerciful;

2 Timothy 3:4 ⁴ traitors, headstrong, haughty, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God,

This is **not** characteristic of God.

He is faithful

2 Tim 2:13

13 If we are faithless, He remains faithful; He cannot deny Himself.

Isaiah 25:1 (NKJV)

O Lord, You *are* my God.
I will exalt You,

tribulations

- 2347 thlípsis properly, <u>pressure</u> (what constricts or rubs together), used of a narrow place that "hems someone in"; tribulation, especially internal pressure that causes someone to feel confined (restricted, "without options").
- 2347 /thlípsis ("compression, tribulation") carries the challenge of coping with the *internal* pressure of a *tribulation*, especially when feeling there is "no way of escape" ("hemmed in").

[By contrast, 4730 (stenoxōría) focuses on the external pressure exerted by circumstances.]

The tribulations of which Paul is speaking are not the troubles that are common to all mankind but the troubles that Christians suffer for the sake of their Lord. One of the less attractive promises that Scripture gives believers is that those who are faithful can be certain of being under pressure from Satan and from the present world system that is under his control. "All who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will be persecuted," Paul assured Timothy (2 Tim. 3:12)

knowing — KNOW BY EXPERIENCING

/eídō ("seeing that becomes knowing") then is a gateway to grasp spiritual truth (reality) from a physical plane. 1492 (eídō) then is physical seeing (sight) which should be the constant bridge to mental and spiritual seeing (comprehension).

produces

Tense: Present Mood: Indicative

Voice: Middle or Passive

katergázomai (from 2596 /katá, "down, exactly according to," intensifying 2038 /ergázomai, "work, accomplish") – literally, "work down to the end-point,"

i.e. to an *exact*, definite conclusion (note the prefix, 2596 /katá); bring to decisive finality (end-conclusion).

perseverance;

hypomoné (from 5259 /hypó, "under" and 3306 /ménō, "remain, endure") – properly, remaining under, endurance; steadfastness, especially as God enables the believer to "remain (endure) under" the challenges He allots in life.

character;

dokimé (a feminine noun derived from 1384 / dókimos) – proof of genuineness ("approval, through testing"), a brand of what is "tested and true." See 1381 (dokimazō).

2 Corinthians 12:7-10 (NKJV)

⁷ And lest I should be exalted above measure by the abundance of the revelations, a thorn in the flesh was given to me, a messenger of Satan to buffet me, lest I be exalted above measure. ⁸ Concerning this thing I pleaded with the Lord three times that it might depart from me. ⁹ And He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness." not disappoint

confound, put to shame

From kata and aischunomai; to shame down, i.e. Disgrace or (by implication) put to the blush -- confound, dishonour, (be a-, make a-)shame(-d).

because the love of God has been poured out

poured out

gush forth, pour out, shed, spill.

Or (by variation) ekchuno ek-khoo'-no from ek and cheo (to pour); to pour forth; figuratively, to bestow -- gush (pour) out, run greedily (out), shed (abroad, forth

The Holy spirit was given to us

Ephesians 1:13–14 (NKJV)
