1. It is often said that, “God loves everyone unconditionally.” How does such a statement hold up when compared to Hebrews 10:26-31?

2. Do you know people who claim to be a Christian, yet actually believe and behave like the description of those mentioned in Hebrews 10:26-31? How could you use the truths expressed in this passage to address them?

3. Some people view grace (unmerited favor of God) as the ability to continue to live in deliberate unrepentant sinfulness. According to this passage, does such a belief and lifestyle please the Holy Spirit? ___ Explain.

4. Paul, similarly writes about the abuse of grace in Romans 6. Read Romans 6:1-14. As Christians, what should we do to make sure that we are not abusing God’s grace?

5. Should a person who claims to be saved, ever test themselves to see if they are truly saved? The author of Hebrews certainly warns that if people trample on the Person of Jesus and His sacrificial work than they will receive God’s wrath. So, is it wise, or untrusting to examine ourselves to see if we are saved?

What would Paul say to such a question? Read 2 Corinthians 13:5.

6. From our view, we may believe that people are Christians who really are not. Over time this is often revealed by the person remaining in unrepentant sin, believing and/or teaching false doctrine, or a lack of desire to do life with other Christians. Read the following passages and determine how these people were to be revealed as non-Christians.
