THE EXALTED SON CARES FOR HIS FAMILY

INTRO: We have been following the history of Joseph as an instrument in the hand of God to preserve his covenant people.

- Joseph through the way of humiliation and exaltation is in a position providentially to feed, protect, and save them in Egypt.
- But all of this is part of God's purpose to construct for the benefit of his church a grand type of salvation.
- -Oh, the power and wisdom of God: He is able to save his people to the uttermost, save them unto his everlasting glory!

I. THE EXALTED SON MEETS HIS FAMILY.

- A. Joseph is the exalted son.
 - 1. Joseph will care for his family, sending for them to come to Egypt during the famine.
 - 2. Providentially through the way of humiliation and exaltation he is in the position to do so.
 - 3. Joseph is ruler in Egypt wisely governing all the affairs that there is much laid up in store.
 - 4. For Joseph's sake, Pharaoh is kindly inclined to the covenant people.
- B. How is Joseph this savior?
 - 1. The era of the Patriarchs is coming to a close with Jacob.
 - 2. Joseph is not a leader of the covenant people. Jacob is.
 - 3. Joseph is not the first born: Reuben is.
 - 4. Judah has become the spokesman for them. He will be the one from whom the scepter will arise.
 - 5. But God providentially puts Joseph in this position.
- C. Joseph meets his family.
 - 1. Abraham sinfully goes to Egypt, but Jacob comes providentially, directly encouraged by God (Gen. 46:2-4).
 - 2. Do you see Jacob riding to Goshen in a wagon, while Joseph rides in a chariot to meet his father?
 - 3. Here is the fulfillment of the dream: the sun bows down to Joseph (Gen. 37:9,11).
 - 4. Thus begins the fulfillment of the prophecy to Abraham in Gen. 15:13-16.
- D. Survival depends upon this exalted son.
 - 1. Joseph takes five of his brothers and his father to meet Pharaoh.
 - 2. The exalted son is not ashamed to call them brothers. He claims these despised people as his own.
 - 3. Joseph secures for them a place in Egypt from Pharaoh.

II. THE EXALTED SON CAUSES HIS FAMILY TO DWELL IN SAFETY ALONE.

- A. A necessary move.
 - 1. The move to Egypt is Joseph's idea and suggestion. God promises a safe journey, protection, and return.
 - 2. The situation in Canaan was critical. Jacob's family was strangers there, owning no land.
 - 3. There is not only the famine, but the greater threat of the affiliation of the covenant family with the Canaanites.
 - 4. Jacob's family is Egypt will grow into a mighty nation of some three million people
 - 5. This sojourn in Egypt is necessary serving the coming of Christ and salvation we have through his cross.
- B. Dwelling safely in Goshen.
 - 1. The necessity of Goshen: Why? Pharaoh undoubtedly in his love for Joseph would have provided royal houses.
 - 2. God through Joseph chose this part of Egypt for his family.
 - 3. The Egyptians would want the Israelites to dwell there, for shepherds were an abomination to the Egyptians (46:34).
 - 4. This place was predetermined by Joseph (45:9,10) and now carefully orchestrated by him.
 - 5. Joseph carefully instructs his brothers to tell Pharaoh what their occupation is, and then sends them in.
 - 6. Pharaoh gives to Jacob's family the best of the land to sojourn in the land of Goshen: a rich provision.
- C. The spiritual reason: care for the cause of the whole covenant people
 - 1. God chose, and this is Joseph's choice in love of God and love of God's people. It was a separate provision.
 - 2. God's people are to dwell alone: It is to be a separation from the heathen.
 - 3. God's Word: Nu. 23:9, Deut. 33:28, II Cor. 6:14-18, Ex. 23: 32,33
 - 4. The necessary antithesis. No mixed marriages, not be tempted with Egypt's idols, idolatrous practices, or culture.
 - 5. There are the two seeds living in enmity: the seed of the woman and the seed of the serpent.
 - 6. Joseph provides a place where Egyptians would not enter and the Israelites would be safe in temptations of Egypt.

III. GOD'S EXALTED SON CAUSES HIS CHURCH TO DWELL IN SAFETY.

- A. God's choice for us and Christ's demand for us is **spiritual separation** in the world.
 - 1. As Canaan was not yet ready for Israel for the iniquity of the Amorites was not full, so also with the wicked world today.
 - 2. God calls us to be in the world, but not of the world.
 - 3. Sadly, much of the church family does not desire Goshen: this separation, but despises God's gift of enmity.
 - 4. Many want to be like the world and cater to the lusts of the flesh.
 - 5. One cannot be friends of God and be friends of the world. Ours must be an antithetical living.

B. A blessed place to dwell.

- 1. The church is still in the world to increase and grow into a mighty nation that no man can count.
- 2. Christ causes us to be the woman who flees into the wilderness (Rev. 12:6,14).
- 3. As Israel received riches from the heathen, so also we do and will inherit the earth. Reprobation serves election.
- C. This blessed place we possess is in and through our Joseph.
 - 1. It is Christ who is in heaven who in his love and grace provides us our place in this Egypt.
 - 2. It is Christ who causes us to be a peculiar people and to grow into a mighty nation.
 - 3. It is Christ, God's exalted Son who nourishes us with his Word and Spirit, according to our families.
 - 4. It is in Christ that the type of bondage in Egypt reveals that God is able to save, preserve, and deliver his people!
