### Scripture Reading

### 1 PETER 1:1–21

## In 1 Peter 1, Peter describes Christians as those who Live in the Desert

- 1. Christians are "elect exiles" (verse 1) or temporary residents (verse 17).
- 2. Christians are still awaiting our inheritance (verse 4).
- 3. Christians are commanded to "gird up the loins of your mind" (verse 13; see Exodus 12:11).
- 4. Christians are commanded to "be holy" (verse 16; see also Leviticus 11:44-45).
- 5. Christians have been ransomed from slavery by the blood of the Passover Lamb (verses 18-19).

#### THE MAIN POINT OF 1 PETER 1:1–21

Every Christian should "live in the desert" with unshakable hope in Jesus, with indomitable joy in Jesus, and with total devotion to Jesus.

### LIVE IN THE DESERT...

- 1. with unshakable hope in Jesus (verses 3–5).
- 2. with indomitable joy in Jesus (verses 6–12).
- 3. with total devotion to Jesus (verses 13–21).
