**Wounded** (1 Cor 8:12)  
**Defiled** (1 Cor 8:7; Tit 1:15)  
**Emboldened** (1 Cor 8:10).  
**Guilty** (Heb 10:22)  
**Seared** (1 Tim 4:2)



Nonbelievers can never  
**quiet their conscience**  
completely

It was symbolic for the present time  
in which both gifts and sacrifices are  
offered which **cannot make him**  
who performed the service **perfect**  
**in regard to the conscience**

Hebrews 9:9



Believers receive a  
**clean conscience**  
before God

How much more shall the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without spot to God, **cleanse your conscience** from dead works to serve the living God?

Hebrews 9:14

Then would they not have ceased to be offered? For the worshipers, once purified, would have had no more consciousness of sins

Hebrews 10:2

Let us draw near with a true heart  
in full assurance of faith, having  
our hearts sprinkled **from an evil  
conscience** and our bodies  
washed with pure water

Hebrews 10:22



There is also an antitype which now saves us—baptism (not the removal of the filth of the flesh, but **the answer of a good conscience toward God**), through the resurrection of Jesus Christ

1 Peter 3:21



Believers must maintain  
**a good conscience**  
before God

Now the purpose of the  
commandment is love from a  
pure heart, from **a good  
conscience**, and from sincere  
faith

1 Timothy 1:5

Having faith and **a good conscience**, which some having rejected, concerning the faith have suffered shipwreck

1 Timothy 1:19

If we say that **we have no sin**, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us

1 John 1:8

If we say that **we have not sinned**, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us

1 John 1:10

**confess known sins**  
to God


If [or whenever] we **confess**
