comedy, wine, architecture, art, money, music, entertainment, sex

The meaning of life is not found in pleasure alone – if God has given you a gift or vision, do not glory in it

V. Experiment III: Searching for meaning in life in morality (2:12-17)

There is some benefit to living wisely

The wise and the fool both end up in the grave

Nihilism – life has absolutely no meaning – hopelessness

The meaning of life cannot be found in religion or moral living alone

VI. Eperiment IV: Searching for meaning by investing in future generations (2:18-23)

Proverbs 13:22 – leaving an inheritance

There is no joy in merely living your life for your children
