"There is one very serious defect to my mind in Christ's moral character, and that is that He believed in hell. I do not myself feel that any person who is really profoundly humane can believe in everlasting punishment. You do not, for instance find that attitude in Socrates. You find him quite bland and urbane toward the people who would not listen to him; and it is, to my mind, far more worthy of a sage to take that line than to take the line of indignation . . . I cannot myself feel that either in the matter of wisdom or in the matter of virtue Christ stands quite as high as some other people known to history. I think I should put Buddha and Socrates above Him in those respects."

FOR MAY:

Central Asia

- This region has more believers in prison than anywhere else in the world. Pray for laws to change, for God to turn the heart of "kings" away from evil and injustice (Proverbs 21:1). India is trying to pass laws in more places that make conversion to Christianity illegal. Pray for all such laws to be prevented or rescinded.
- Samida was demeaned and beaten for bringing shame upon his household by becoming a Christian. This sister in Christ was rejected by her family, told that she would never be able to marry or have a family of her own, and beaten publicly by her own mother in the town square for dishonoring her family. Her parents have forced her to sleep outside in the shed with animals. Please pray for God to intervene and to reverse her unjust humiliation, and to provide her a safe situation.

Sub-Saharan Africa

Christians are favorite targets of various militant groups simply for following Jesus. Ask the Lord to lay a blanket of tolerance over the hearts of those who persecute His people. Pray for all those who persecuted the church and harm our brothers and sisters. Ask God to awaken their hearts through the Spirit, to illuminate their minds to see the truth of the gospel and to be saved themselves.

Iran

- In many places believers in Jesus are by necessity secret believers, with their livelihood and freedom at constant risk. Iran has jailed many Christians just for attending house churches or gathering in small groups. Please lift them up to the care of the Lord
- A man was seized by the police, interrogated for 10 hours a day for months, tortured and given a suspended sentence because he converted from Islam. He eventually had to flee Iran to survive. Pray for all those who have been forced to enter into exile because of their faith.

Please pray and intercede for your brothers and sisters in the faith. Let us not cease day or night until injustice ends.
