- The chapter speaks of God's preserving work in the hearts of true believers.
- Three other passages of Scripture relate directly or indirectly to this.
- One writing which is of no value in understanding our text is the apocryphal Song of Three Children in the Furnace.

Daniel: God's Antithetical, Indestructible, Triumphant Kingdom (5) Daniel's Three Friends Tried by Fire

- 1) Serving Jehovah Alone.
 - a) The occasion for the trial by fire was the refusal of these men to worship the image which Nebuchadnezzar had set up.
 - b) The antithetical character of God's kingdom is underscored: God's saints do not worship images which men set up, even under great pressure to do so.
- 2) Enduring the Fires of Affliction.
 - a) Significantly, the punishment which Nebuchadnezzar meted out took the form of throwing them into a burning fiery furnace.
 - b) They endured this trial, by grace; God's kingdom is indestructible!
- 3) Coming Forth as Gold.
 - a) Fire can destroy; but it can also purify and manifest precious metals to be genuine.
 - b) God's kingdom triumphs when, after our faith is tried, we come forth as gold!
