It is Paul's best. Aptly addressed to "all who are in Rome", Romanists of our day would do well to give it a hearing.</p> <p>Neither Paul nor Peter started the church of Rome. It was well established by the time of this letter, probably due to the Gospel preached (by Peter) on the Day of Pentecost (AD 33) to the "visitors from Rome." Tacitus refers to the persecuted Christians (in Rome) under Nero (64 AD) as "an immense multitude." Gentiles predominated, but Jews were there too.</p> <p>The letter was written in AD 57, from Corinth, near the end of Paul's third preaching tour. His listing of mutual friends (ch. 16), as in the book of Colossians, is a suggestion that Paul had never been to either Rome or Colossae. It would seem that the motivation for the letter is found in chapter 15, where Paul encourages Jews and Gentiles to receive one another, and magnifies his ministry to those who before had been considered outside the love of God.</p> <p>About ROME, the city of 7 hills: (per Halley) "Queen City of the Earth. Center of History. For two millenniums...dominating power of the world. Still called the "Eternal City." Population then, 1,500,000, half slaves.
