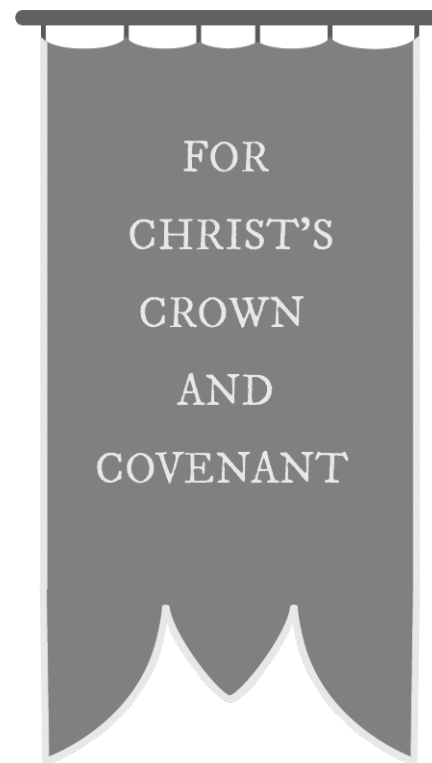
Pray...

- That we would be thoughtful in anticipating our needs (Proverbs 14:16; 22:3)
- That we would not enter into temptation (Luke 22:39; Matthew 6:13)
- For humility, understanding we are prone to fall (1 Corinthians 10:12)
- To seek the promised way of escape in temptations (1 Corinthians 10:13)
- For our flesh's weakness to be overcome by the Spirit's power (Eph. 6:18)
- That we would heed our Good Shepherd when He rebukes our spiritual slumber (Matthew 26:40).
- That we would not tempt others to sin with our own actions (Matthew 18:7).
- That we would incline our heart toward matters which "exercise godliness" (1 Timothy 4:7).
- For a competent portion of those things we need in this life (Matthew 6:11), including food, work, and covering.
- Pray that the Lord would preserve our congregation's lampstand (Rev 2:5) and witness to McKinney, especially in this transition.
- Pray for our families, that the Lord would preserve our families and call all the covenant children to Himself (Acts 2:38), not depart from the way in which they should go (Proverbs 22:6), and provide godly spouses for them.
- Pray for our congregation, that we would walk as befitting the sons and daughters of light (Ephesians 5:8), that the world would perceive us as His children and give glory to God.
- Pray for the church as she is persecuted and that she would have a godly witness (Matthew 5:10). Pray that the church in our nation would not be persecuted so we could live godly lives (1 Timothy 2:2).
- Pray for the increase of Christ's Kingdom over the earth (Matthew 6:10).
- That we would praise Jesus for His great care for us (Luke 22:40, 45) and for fulfilling all righteousness (Matthew 3:15) on our behalf.
