3)	Develop a list of As you study and categorize the verses, prepare a few questions that will serve to maximize your study. If you are study ing the topic "Giving to God." good questions to ask along with your study

Obviously, these questions may change from study to study. The goal of a topical study is not just to find verses. Rather, it is to find truth to life and grant for the future.				
4) Categorize your verses according to the questions. This is perhaps the most part of a topical study. Often, the more verses a topic has the more questions can be created. Categorizing them can prove a challenge. To help, create a table on a sheet of paper (Excel may be helpful). As you continue through this process, you may find that you have some verses that overlap with some of your questions. If this is often the case, you may want to re-structure or a question.
