Title: "AS HE IS SO ARE WE"

Text: 1 John 4:17

Subject: The Believer's Conformity to Christ

**Introduction**:

Let's turn to 1 John 4:17.

(1 John 4:17) "Herein is our love made perfect, that we may have boldness in the day of judgment: because as he is, so are we in this world."

"As He is so are we in this world." — What an astounding statement! If these were not the words of God Himself we might well consider such a statement as this the most arrogant, presumptuous, blasphemous statement that ever fell from the lips or pen of man. But these are the words of God Himself.

— "As He is so are we in this world!"

We are told in Romans 8:29 that the object of God

in predestination and in providence is that all His elect "be conformed to the image of His Son." Here John declares that God's great purpose is accomplished, at least in measure, "because as He is so are we in this world." Our hearts' great desire, our souls' great ambition is that we be made conformable to our blessed Savior in His death. Is it not? Here the Holy Spirit assures us that our hearts' desire is, in great measure satisfied, "because as He is so are we in this world." Let's look at the three things the Apostle John states in this verse together.

#### **LOVE MADE PERFECT**

First, he tells us about love made perfect. — "Herein is our love made perfect." John has been telling us about God's marvelous, infinite, eternal love for us in Christ. God's love for us is revealed in the salvation of our souls by the sin-atoning sacrifice of His dear Son for us as our Substitute and by our union with our blessed Substitute (1 John 3:1-3; 3:16; 4:9-12).

(1 John 3:1-3) "Behold, what manner of love the Father hath bestowed upon us, that we should be called the sons of God: therefore the world knoweth us not, because it knew him not. (2) Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is. (3) And every man that hath this hope in him purifieth himself, even as he is pure."

(1 John 3:16) "Hereby perceive we the love *of God*, because he laid down his life for us: and we ought to lay down *our* lives for the brethren."

(1 John 4:9-12) "In this was manifested the love of God toward us, because that God sent his only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through him. (10) Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. (11) Beloved, if God so loved us, we ought also to love one another. (12) No man hath seen God at any time.

If we love one another, God dwelleth in us, and his love is perfected in us."

"Herein is our love made perfect." — If you have a marginal reference you will notice an alternative translation. The text might be better translated, "Herein is love with us made perfect." John is not talking about us loving God perfectly, or loving one another perfectly. Our love is anything but perfect love. John is talking to us about the knowledge and revelation of God's perfect love for us in Christ in the sweet experience of his saving grace. He is here describing the "grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God." Look at Romans 5:1-5.

(Romans 5:1-5) "Therefore being justified, by faith we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ: (2) By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God. (3) And not only so, but we glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience; (4)

And patience, experience; and experience, hope: (5) And hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us."

God's love toward us, which is shed abroad in our hearts by the knowledge of Christ, is made perfect in us when we are made to see and experience and enjoy the fullness, completion, and perfection of our salvation in Christ.

#### THE DAY OF JUDGMENT

The *second* thing John mentions is the Day of Judgment; but he says something that appears, at first glance, to be a very strange thing about that day. — "Herein is God's love made perfect in us, that we may have boldness in the Day of Judgment." — There is a day appointed when God shall judge the world in righteousness and strict justice. In that day, though the wicked and unbelieving tremble and fear, the saints of God will have confidence, joy and boldness.

"Bold shall I stand in that great day,
For who ought to my charge shall lay,
While through Christ's blood absolved I am
From sin's tremendous guilt and blame?"

The wicked and unbelieving fear the Day of Judgment. Some of you have nightmares about it. But God's saints love it, long for it, and anxiously await it, at least we ought to (Psalms 96:1-2, 11-13; 98:1-9).

Psalm 96:1-13 <sup>1</sup> O sing unto the LORD a new song: sing unto the LORD, all the earth. <sup>2</sup> Sing unto the LORD, bless his name; shew forth his salvation from day to day. <sup>3</sup> Declare his glory among the heathen, his wonders among all people. <sup>4</sup> For the LORD is great, and greatly to be praised: he is to be feared above all gods. <sup>5</sup> For all the gods of the nations are idols: but the LORD made the heavens. <sup>6</sup> Honour and majesty are before him: strength and beauty are in his sanctuary. <sup>7</sup> Give unto the LORD, O ye kindreds

of the people, give unto the LORD glory and strength. <sup>8</sup> Give unto the LORD the glory *due unto* his name: bring an offering, and come into his courts. <sup>9</sup> O worship the LORD in the beauty of holiness: fear before him, all the earth. <sup>10</sup> Say among the heathen *that* the LORD reigneth: the world also shall be established that it shall not be moved: he shall judge the people righteously.

Let the heavens rejoice, and let the earth be glad; let the sea roar, and the fulness thereof.

Let the field be joyful, and all that is therein: then shall all the trees of the wood rejoice

Before the LORD: for he cometh, for he cometh to judge the earth: he shall judge the world with righteousness, and the people with his truth.

Psalm 98:1-9 <sup>1</sup> O sing unto the LORD a new song; for he hath done marvellous things: his right hand, and his holy arm, hath gotten him the victory. <sup>2</sup> The LORD hath made known his salvation: his righteousness hath he openly

shewed in the sight of the heathen. <sup>3</sup> He hath remembered his mercy and his truth toward the house of Israel: all the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God. <sup>4</sup> Make a joyful noise unto the LORD, all the earth: make a loud noise, and rejoice, and sing praise. 5 Sing unto the LORD with the harp; with the harp, and the voice of a psalm. <sup>6</sup> With trumpets and sound of cornet make a joyful noise before the LORD, the King. <sup>7</sup> Let the sea roar, and the fulness thereof; the world, and they that dwell therein. <sup>8</sup> Let the floods clap their hands: let the hills be joyful together <sup>9</sup> Before the LORD; for he cometh to judge the earth: with righteousness shall he judge the world, and the people with equity.

Yes, we who are God's should look forward to the Day of Judgment with the joy of confident faith. In that great day, we shall stand fearless, without the least dread, while the rest of the world cries for the rocks and mountains to fall upon them and hide them from the wrath of God and the Lamb. In that great

day, when God shall judge the world in righteousness, God's elect will have boldness. In that day we will have boldness, holy confidence, to stand before the bar of God, complete freedom, the boldness of an innocent, guiltless, sinless, perfectly righteous people, the very same freedom that our God-man Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ has before the bar of God!

Would you have this boldness in the Day of Judgment? What is the basis of it? Where can it be found? Read the next line. "Herein is our love (God's love with us) made perfect, that we may have boldness in the day of judgment: because (Here is the cause of that boldness.) as He is so are we in this world." I say, again, "What an astounding statement!"

#### AS HE IS

This is the thing I want us to think about: — "<u>As He</u> <u>is so are we in this world</u>." Are you a believer? Are you a child of God? Are you redeemed by the

precious blood of Christ? If so, this text applies to you. If at this very moment you trust Christ, if you have just this moment been born of God, this text is talking about you. As Christ is so are you in this world! It is our union with and identification with Christ that will give us boldness in the Day of Judgment.

**Proposition:** Everything that the Lord Jesus Christ is, in His office capacity as our Mediator, Representative, and Substitute before God we are in Him.

The Holy Spirit does not say, "As He was, so are we." That would carry us back to our Savior's life on earth and would make us think that if there is a moral likeness between him and us that moral likeness will give us boldness in the Day of Judgment. Without question God's saving grace works in us such a likeness, causing us to love God and love one another; but that likeness could never give us boldness in the Day of Judgment because that likeness is only a very vague similarity at best.

Only the most arrogant self-righteousness could ever imagine that we are as He was in conduct or in character. Yet, we can look up to Christ in heaven and say, with assurance, what He has said, that because He lives we shall live also. And the Holy Spirit here teaches us to say, with that same assurance, "As He is, so are we in this world."

The Holy Spirit does not say, "As He was, so are we." And he does not say "As He is, so we shall be in the world to come." The text reads, "As He is, so are we in this world." John is speaking of the perfection of our acceptance in the Beloved. That and that alone casts all fear out of our souls. Our eyes are taken off self and fixed upon Christ. God's perfect love for us in Christ, shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Spirit, "casteth out fear" from our hearts.

If I really believe and am sure that God has made me now to be what Christ is, how can I fear the Day of Judgment? The Day of Judgment will only display the completeness and perfection, not only

of what Christ has done for me, but also of what I am by the grace of God in Christ.

The whole purpose of God's grace toward us is that we should be conformed to the image of His dear Son. To that end...

- God the Father chose us in eternal election (Ephesians 1:3-4) and predestinated all things from eternity (Romans 8:29).
- God the Son redeemed us with His own precious blood (Ephesians 5:25-27).
- God the Holy Spirit regenerated us, called us, gave us faith in Christ, and preserves us in grace (Jude 24-25).

We know that God will accomplish His purpose, ultimately, in resurrection glory. But here the Apostle John tells us that God's whole purpose concerning us is, at least in a sense, now accomplished in us and for us by virtue of our saving union with Christ. — "Because as He is, so are we in this world!" Right now, living in this world "as He is, so are we." I cannot begin to

expound the meaning of those words. But I hope, by the help of God the Holy Spirit, to convey to your heart the glorious message of them. If I can do that, I will have fulfilled the charge the Lord God has given me as His servant, saying, "Comfort ye, comfort ye my people"

## 1. THE BEGOTTON SON

As the Lord Jesus Christ, our Savior, is the begotten Son of God, so are we! — Christ is the Son of God by nature, eternally begotten of the Father. In that sense, He is "the only begotten Son" of God. But we are the sons of God by adoption and grace. The man Christ Jesus, our Mediator, is the Firstborn among many brethren (Romans 8:29). And we are His brethren, the sons of God. And He is not ashamed to call us His brethren, because we are truly the sons of God with Him (Hebrews 2:11).

- God chose us to be His sons in eternal election and adopted us (Ephesians 1:5).
- God loved us as His sons (1 John 3:1).

• God gave us the nature of His Son in regeneration (2 Peter 1:4).

(2 Peter 1:3-4) "According as his divine power hath given unto us <u>all things that pertain unto</u> <u>life and godliness</u>, <u>through the knowledge of him that hath called us</u> to glory and virtue: (4) Whereby are given unto us exceeding <u>great and precious promises</u>: that by these ye might be <u>partakers of the divine nature</u>, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust."

We were begotten of God in the new birth by the power and grace of His Spirit (Galatians 4:6; James 1:18; 1 Peter 1:23; John 1:13).

(Galatians 4:6) "And because ye are sons, God hath sent forth the Spirit of his Son into your hearts, crying, Abba, Father."

(James 1:18) "Of his own will begat he us with the word of truth, that we should be a kind of firstfruits of his creatures."

(1 Peter 1:23) "Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth for ever."

(John 1:13) "Which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God."

The Lord Jesus Christ, who "loved us, and washed us from our sins in his own blood," is "the first begotten of the dead" (Revelation 1:5); and the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, "according to his abundant mercy hath begotten us again unto a lively hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead" (1 Peter 1:3). — "Beloved, now are we the sons of God!" We are the sons of God by adoption and grace! As Christ is the Son of God, so are we the sons of God in this world!

#### 2. LOVED OF GOD

(John 17:23-24) "I in them, and thou in me, that

they may be made perfect in one; and that the world may know that thou hast sent me, and hast loved them, as thou hast loved me. (24) Father, I will that they also, whom thou hast given me, be with me where I am; that they may behold my glory, which thou hast given me: for thou lovedst me before the foundation of the world."

As Christ is loved of God with an everlasting love, so are we! — "Thou hast loved them as thou hast loved Me...Thou lovedest Me before the foundation of the world" (John 17:23-24). — Try to grasp the meaning of those words, which fell from the lips of the Lord Jesus Christ as He spoke to God the Father for us. — As He is loved of God from eternity, with an immutable love of complacency and delight, because of His pledged obedience to the Father as our Surety (John 10:16-18), even so we are loved of God.

(John 10:16-18) "And other sheep I have, which are not of this fold: them also I must bring, and

they shall hear my voice; and there shall be one fold, and one shepherd. (17) Therefore doth my Father love me, because I lay down my life, that I might take it again. (18) No man taketh it from me, but I lay it down of myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again. This commandment have I received of my Father."

- God loves us as He sees us in Christ.
- God loves us **for Christ's sake**.
- God loves us <u>as He loves the Lord Jesus Christ, to the same degree, for the same reason.</u> Eternal love! Immutable love! Everlasting love! Perfect love! Free Love, Yet Earned Love! —Totally Undeserved! Yet Fully Deserved!

God loves us without beginning, without cause, without end, and without change! Child of God, here is sweet water drawn from the well of salvation. You are loved of God, right now!

#### 3. GOD'S ELECT

As the Lord Jesus Christ is Elect, chosen of God, and precious, so are we.

(1 Peter 2:6) "Wherefore also it is contained in the scripture, Behold, I lay in Sion a chief corner stone, elect, precious: and he that believeth on him shall not be confounded."

(Isaiah 42:1-4) "Behold my servant, whom I uphold; mine elect, in whom my soul delighteth; I have put my spirit upon him: he shall bring forth judgment to the Gentiles. (2) He shall not cry, nor lift up, nor cause his voice to be heard in the street. (3) A bruised reed shall he not break, and the smoking flax shall he not quench: he shall bring forth judgment unto truth. (4) He shall not fail nor be discouraged, till he have set judgment in the earth: and the isles shall wait for his law."

(Isaiah 43:4) "Since thou wast precious in my

sight, thou hast been honourable, and I have loved thee: therefore will I give men for thee, and people for thy life."

Christ was chosen of God <u>to be our Surety</u>. We were chosen to be His people. He was chosen <u>to be our Savior</u>. We were chosen to be saved. He was chosen <u>to be our Redeemer</u>. We were chosen to be redeemed. He was chosen <u>to be the Head of all things</u>. We were chosen to be His body. He was chosen <u>to be the Foundation Stone</u>. We were chosen to be the temple and building of God.

"Christ be my first Elect," He said,
Then chose our souls in Christ our Head,
Before He gave the mountains birth
Or laid foundations for the earth.

Thus did eternal love begin To raise us up from death and sin; Our characters were then decreed, "Blameless in love, a holy seed."

Predestinated to be sons,
Born by degrees, but chose at once,
A new, regenerated race
To praise the glory of His grace!

With Christ our Lord our souls are one In the affections of His heart; Nor shall our souls be thence removed Till God forgets His first Beloved!

—<u>Watts</u>

#### 4. WELL- PLEASING

As the Lord Jesus Christ, our Substitute, is well pleasing to God, so are we in this world. — When Peter, James, and John were in the mount of transfiguration with the Lord Jesus, Moses and Elijah appeared before them, talking with the Savior. Peter was so pleased that he wanted to build three tabernacles, one for Moses, one for Elijah, and one for the Lord Jesus. He appeared to place the law of God and the prophets of God upon equal ground with the Son of God! But God stepped in and said, Never!

— "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased!" (Matthew 17:1-5).

(Matthew 17:1-5) "And after six days Jesus taketh Peter, James, and John his brother, and bringeth them up into an high mountain apart, (2) And was transfigured before them: and his face did shine as the sun, and his raiment was white as the light. (3) And, behold, there appeared unto them Moses and Elias talking with him. (4) Then answered Peter, and said unto Jesus, Lord, it is good for us to be here: if thou wilt, let us make here three tabernacles; one for thee, and one for Moses, and one for Elias. (5) While he yet spake, behold, a bright cloud overshadowed them: and behold a voice out of the cloud, which said, This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased; hear ye him."

God almighty is pleased with no one and nothing but his Son.

#### **JESUS ONLY**

After God spoke, "when they had lifted up their eyes, they saw no man, save Jesus only!" (Matthew 17:8).

— <u>Blessed blindness is that blindness caused by SON-burnt eyes!</u> — Blessed is that man who sees no man, save Jesus only, as the object of God's pleasure! — Blessed are those people who sit under a preacher who sees nothing, but Jesus only as the theme of Holy Scripture. Be sure you learn these two things from the mount of transfiguration...

- God is pleased only with His Son. His Person! His Obedience! His Blood! His Intercession!
- But, blessed be his name, God is pleased with us because we are in his Son, robed with his righteousness, and washed in his blood! "He hath made us accepted in the Beloved" (Ephesians 1:6). Accepted From Eternity! Accepted Right Now! Accepted At All Times! Accepted Immutability! Accepted Forever!

Yet more, the Lord God is well-pleased with what

we offer him because we are one with his Son (1 Peter 2:5).

(1 Peter 2:5) "Ye also, as lively stones, are built up a spiritual house, an holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices, acceptable to God by Jesus Christ."

Imagine that! As God is pleased with his Son, He is pleased with me! — "Because as He is, so are we in this world!" As God is pleased with and accepts the obedience of His darling Son, He is pleased with and accepts my feeble efforts at obedience! — "Because as He is, so are we in this world!" The God of Glory is pleased with our desire to please Him, pleased with our efforts to please Him, "because as He is, so are we in this world," — well-pleasing to God!

(Ecclesiastes 9:7-10) "Go thy way, eat thy bread with joy, and drink thy wine with a merry heart; for God now accepteth thy works. (8) Let thy garments be always white; and let thy head lack no ointment. (9) Live joyfully with the wife

whom thou lovest all the days of the life of thy vanity, which he hath given thee under the sun, all the days of thy vanity: for that *is* thy portion in *this* life, and in thy labour which thou takest under the sun. (10) Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do *it* with thy might; for *there is* no work, nor device, nor knowledge, nor wisdom, in the grave, whither thou goest."

#### 5. FREED FROM SIN

As the Lord Jesus Christ is justified from all sin, so are we (1 John 3:5; Romans 6:6-11).

(1 John 3:5) "And ye know that he was manifested to take away our sins; and in him is no sin."

(Romans 6:6-11) "Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with *him*, that the body of sin might be destroyed, that henceforth we should not serve sin. (7) **For he that is dead is freed from sin**. (8) Now if we be dead with Christ, we

Knowing that Christ being raised from the dead dieth no more; death hath no more dominion over him. (10) For in that he died, he died unto sin once: but in that he liveth, he liveth unto God. (11) Likewise reckon ye also yourselves to be dead indeed unto sin, but alive unto God through Jesus Christ our Lord."

McCheyne said, "When Christ was made to be sin for us and crucified as our sin-bearer, He was buried, and His body laid in the tomb for three days in an unjustified state. And on the third day, when He rose from the dead, 'He was justified in the Spirit.'" (1 Timothy 3:16). — "He was manifested to take away our sins; and in him is no sin" (1 John 3:5).

<u>Illustration</u>: Christ the Paschal Lamb was slain for our sins. — Christ the Scapegoat carried our sins into the tomb. — Christ the Fit Man returned from the grave without sin!

"With His spotless garments on

I am as holy as God's Son!"

Children of God, behold the risen Christ and understand that the law has no more dominion over Him and "as He is so are we in this world" (Romans 7:4). — Sin has no more dominion over Him, and "as he is so are we in this world" (Romans 6:18; 1 Peter 4:1).

(1 Peter 4:1-2) "Forasmuch then as Christ hath suffered for us in the flesh, arm yourselves likewise with the same mind: for he that hath suffered in the flesh hath ceased from sin; (2) That he no longer should live the rest of *his* time in the flesh to the lusts of men, but to the will of God."

<u>Death has no more dominion over him</u>, and "as he is so are we in this world" (1 Corinthians 15:55-57; Hebrews 2:15).

(1 Corinthians 15:55-57) "O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory? (56) The

sting of death is sin; and the strength of sin is the law. (57) But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."

(Hebrews 2:15) "And deliver them who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage."

## 6. A STRANGER

As the Son of God is a stranger to this world, so are we. — "The world knoweth us not, because it knew Him not" (John 1:10-11; Isaiah 53:1-3).

(Isaiah 53:1-3) "Who hath believed our report? and to whom is the arm of the LORD revealed? (2) For he shall grow up before him as a tender plant, and as a root out of a dry ground: he hath no form nor comeliness; and when we shall see him, there is no beauty that we should desire him. (3) He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief: and we hid as it were our faces from him; he was

despised, and we esteemed him not."

(John 1:10-11) "He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not. (11) He came unto his own, and his own received him not."

And as long as we are in this world, if we follow him, we will be strangers to it (John 15:17-20; 16:1-3).

(John 15:17-20) "These things I command you, that ye love one another. (18) If the world hate you, ye know that it hated me before it hated you. (19) If ye were of the world, the world would love his own: but because ye are not of the world, but I have chosen you out of the world, therefore the world hateth you. (20) Remember the world that I said unto you, The servant is not greater than his lord. If they have persecuted me, they will also persecute you; if they have kept my saying, they will keep yours also."

(John 16:1-3) "These things have I spoken unto you, that ye should not be offended. (2) They shall put you out of the synagogues: yea, the time cometh, that whosoever killeth you will think that he doeth God service. (3) And these things will they do unto you, because they have not known the Father, nor me."

"Marvel not, my brethren, if the world hate you" (1 John 3:13). The Lord Jesus places this badge of honor upon all his disciples, "They are not of the world, even as I am not of the world" (John 17:16). We are not of...

- The World's Religion!
- The World's Philosophy!
- The World's Fashion!
- The World's Ambition!
- The World's Mind! (1 Corinthians 2:14-16 "We have the mind of Christ!")

#### 7. JEHOVAH'S SERVANT

As the Lord Jesus Christ is the Servant of God, so are we (Isaiah 42:1-4).

(Isaiah 42:1-4) "Behold my servant, whom I uphold; mine elect, in whom my soul delighteth; I have put my spirit upon him: he shall bring forth judgment to the Gentiles. (2) He shall not cry, nor lift up, nor cause his voice to be heard in the street. (3) A bruised reed shall he not break, and the smoking flax shall he not quench: he shall bring forth judgment unto truth. (4) He shall not fail nor be discouraged, till he have set judgment in the earth: and the isles shall wait for his law."

The Son of God "took on Him the form of a servant and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross" (Philippians 2:7-8). He "came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give His life a ransom for many" (Matthew 20:25-28).

Paul called himself "the servant (bond slave) of Jesus Christ." As Christ was the Servant of God, and

as He is now even in heaven, the Servant of God, "so are we in this world." If we are born of God, we are the servants of God. I am sometimes asked, "What does it take for a person to be a Christian?" I know the answer to that question — "Nothing from me, but all of me" (Luke 14:25-33).

(Luke 14:25-33) "And there went great multitudes with him: and he turned, and said unto them, (26) If any man come to me, and hate not his father, and mother, and wife, and children, and brethren, and sisters, yea, and his own life also, he cannot be my disciple. (27) And whosoever doth not bear his cross, and come after me, cannot be my disciple. (28) For which of you, intending to build a tower, sitteth not down first, and counteth the cost, whether he have sufficient to finish it? (29) Lest haply, after he hath laid the foundation, and is not able to finish it, all that behold it begin to mock him, (30) Saying, This man began to build, and was not able to finish. (31) Or what king, going to make war against another king, sitteth not down

first, and consulteth whether he be able with ten thousand to meet him that cometh against him with twenty thousand? (32) Or else, while the other is yet a great way off, he sendeth an ambassage, and desireth conditions of peace. (33) So likewise, whosoever he be of you that forsaketh not all that he hath, he cannot be my disciple."

#### **Illustrations:** "Chief give himself to Jesus."

When Pete Rose was in his prime with the Cincinnati Reds, one of the sports announcers watching him said, "The man only knows one way to play this game — 100%!" That is the only way to serve God — 100%!

The Bible tells us, by picture and by precept what a servant is. Let me give you this and I will send you home.

A servant is one who, having counted the cost, willingly has his ear bored (Exodus 21:1-6).

(Exodus 21:1-6) "Now these are the judgments which thou shalt set before them. (2) If thou buy an Hebrew servant, six years he shall serve: and in the seventh he shall go out free for nothing. (3) If he came in by himself, he shall go out by himself: if he were married, then his wife shall go out with him. (4) If his master have given him a wife, and she have born him sons or daughters; the wife and her children shall be her master's, and he shall go out by himself. (5) And if the servant shall plainly say, I love my master, my wife, and my children; I will not go out free: (6) Then his master shall bring him unto the judges; he shall also bring him to the door, or unto the door post; and his master shall bore his ear through with an awl; and he shall serve him for ever."

Illustrations: Moses (Hebrews 11:24)

Believer's Baptism (Romans 6:4-6)

Jephthah

The servant has only one object in life — The glory, honor, and will of his master! — He submits his life's ambitions and blueprints to his master, desiring not his will, but his master's will, desiring not his way, but his master's way. He says, "I love my master, I will not go out free." Are we the servants of God? — Then...

- Whatsoever we do in word or in deed, let us do all for the glory of God!
- Let us resolve that no flesh glory in his presence.
- Let us say with Paul, "God forbid that I should glory save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ."

<u>Illustration</u>: If two angels were sent by God to the earth, one to rule a nation and the other to sweep the streets for the glory of God, they would not care which they did.

(1 Corinthians 3:5-9) "Who then is Paul, and who *is* Apollos, but ministers by whom ye believed, even as the Lord gave to every man? (6) I have planted, Apollos watered; but God

gave the increase. (7) So then neither is he that planteth anything, neither he that watereth; but God that giveth the increase. (8) Now he that planteth and he that watereth are one: and every man shall receive his own reward according to his own labour. (9) For we are labourers together with God: ye are God's husbandry, ye are God's building."

The servant of God calls nothing his own (Acts 4:32).

# <u>Illustration</u>: The Pearl Merchant and the Great Pearl

"So likewise, whosoever he be of you that forsaketh not all that he hath, he cannot be my disciple" (Luke 14:3). Let me put this into plain English...

• One man and his wife can build a house for their family, but a preacher and twelve men cannot erect a house of worship for the glory of God. — Give me twelve disciples, anywhere in the world, and I will!

- One man can send three children through college, but twelve men cannot send a missionary out to preach the gospel. Give me twelve disciples, and I will!
- One man can open a produce stand and faithfully sit by the road peddling produce until 25 years later he has a chain of grocery stores. Where is the disciple who is so determined, so committed, so faithful to the glory of God?

# The servant wants nothing, but to hear his Master say, "Well done!"

<u>Illustration</u>: The preacher and his airline companion. I'm in business with my father — So am I. Our business is jewels — Ours, too! We only deal in the best of jewels — Us too! I'm on my way home now to meet my father — So am I! I sure hope he will be pleased with what I've done — So do I!

One more thing I must tell you before I send you home — <u>As Christ is now, so shall we be in the world to come!</u>

(John 17:5) "And now, O Father, glorify thou me with thine own self with the glory which I had with thee before the world was."

(John 17:22) "And the glory which thou gavest me I have given them; that they may be one, even as we are one:"

(1 John 3:1-2) "Behold, what manner of love the Father hath bestowed upon us, that we should be called the sons of God: therefore the world knoweth us not, because it knew him not. (2)

Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is."

#### **Illustration:** Rowland Hill's Dream

(Jude 1:24-25) "Now unto him that is able to keep you from falling, and to present *you* faultless before the presence of his glory with exceeding joy, (25) To the only wise God our Saviour, *be* glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and for ever. Amen."

In the light of these things, I call you and call myself to utter commitment, devotion and consecration to our God in Christ (Romans 12:1-2; 1 Corinthians 6:19-20; 10:31).

(Romans 12:1-2) "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. (2)

And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what *is* that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God."

(1 Corinthians 6:19-20) "What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own? (20) For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's."

(1 Corinthians 10:31) "Whether therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God."
