LITERARY OVERVIEW

<u>Title</u>: 1 Kings, originally one book together with 2 Kings. In the Septuagint, they were titled "3rd and 4th Kingdoms" (together with 1 and 2 Samuel).

<u>Author</u>: According to Talmudic tradition, the prophet Jeremiah. Possibly him or contemporary compiler who was pulling from various other sources.

<u>Date</u>: Covering the period beginning with Solomon's reign (c. 971 B.C.) through Ahaziah's reign (ending c. 851 B.C.). A key date is 931 B.C., the ear the kingdom was divided into the northern nation (Israel) and the southern nation (Judah).

<u>Purpose/Plot</u>: A prophetically oriented evaluation of the kingdom, with particular evaluation of the various monarchs and how their morality affected the nation.

Main Characters: Solomon, Rehoboam and Jeraboam, Ahab and Jezebel, Elijah, and other kings.

Form/Genre: Selective historical narrative with emphasis on moral dimension.
