- "hate what is evil; cling to what is good" (v. 9)
- "Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good" (v. 21)

2 Corinthians 10:3–5: For though we live in the world, we do not wage war as the world does. ⁴ The weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world. On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds. ⁵ We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ. <u>Current cultural case study on why counter-culture vs. cultural terms is important - **JUSTICE** Justice is important to God! Luke 11:42 "But woe to you Pharisees! For you pay tithe of mint and rue and every kind of garden herb, and yet disregard **justice** and the love of God…" (NASB)</u>

Micah 6:8 "He has told you, O man, what is good; And what does the LORD require of you But to do justice, to love kindness, And to walk humbly with your God?"

Proverbs 31:8 (NIV): "Speak up for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute ... ⁹ Speak up and judge fairly ["ensure justice for those being crushed ... see that they get justice" (NLT)]; defend the rights of the poor and needy."

Isaiah 1:17: "learn to do good; seek justice, correct oppression; bring justice to the fatherless, plead the widow's cause. ¹⁸ Come now, let us reason together, says the LORD: though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow…" (ESV, note the key connection to the gospel)

<u>Scriptural justice</u> is important but secular "<u>social justice</u>" movements can take away from scriptural principles and the gospel (<u>Voddie Baucham audio link</u>, consider also James 1:19-20)

Compare "black lives matter" as a true *statement* vs. the "Black Lives Matter" *Organization*

- <u>www.blacklivesmatter.com</u> beliefs: "We foster a queer-affirming network. When we gather, we do so with the intention of freeing ourselves from the tight grip of heteronormative thinking..."
- "We make space for transgender brothers and sisters to ... lead. We are self-reflexive and do the work required to dismantle cisgender privilege [gender based on birth sex] and uplift Black trans folk ..."
 - "We disrupt the Western-prescribed nuclear family structure [mother and father family]..."
 - "We deserve and demand reproductive justice that gives autonomy over our bodies" [2/14/18]
