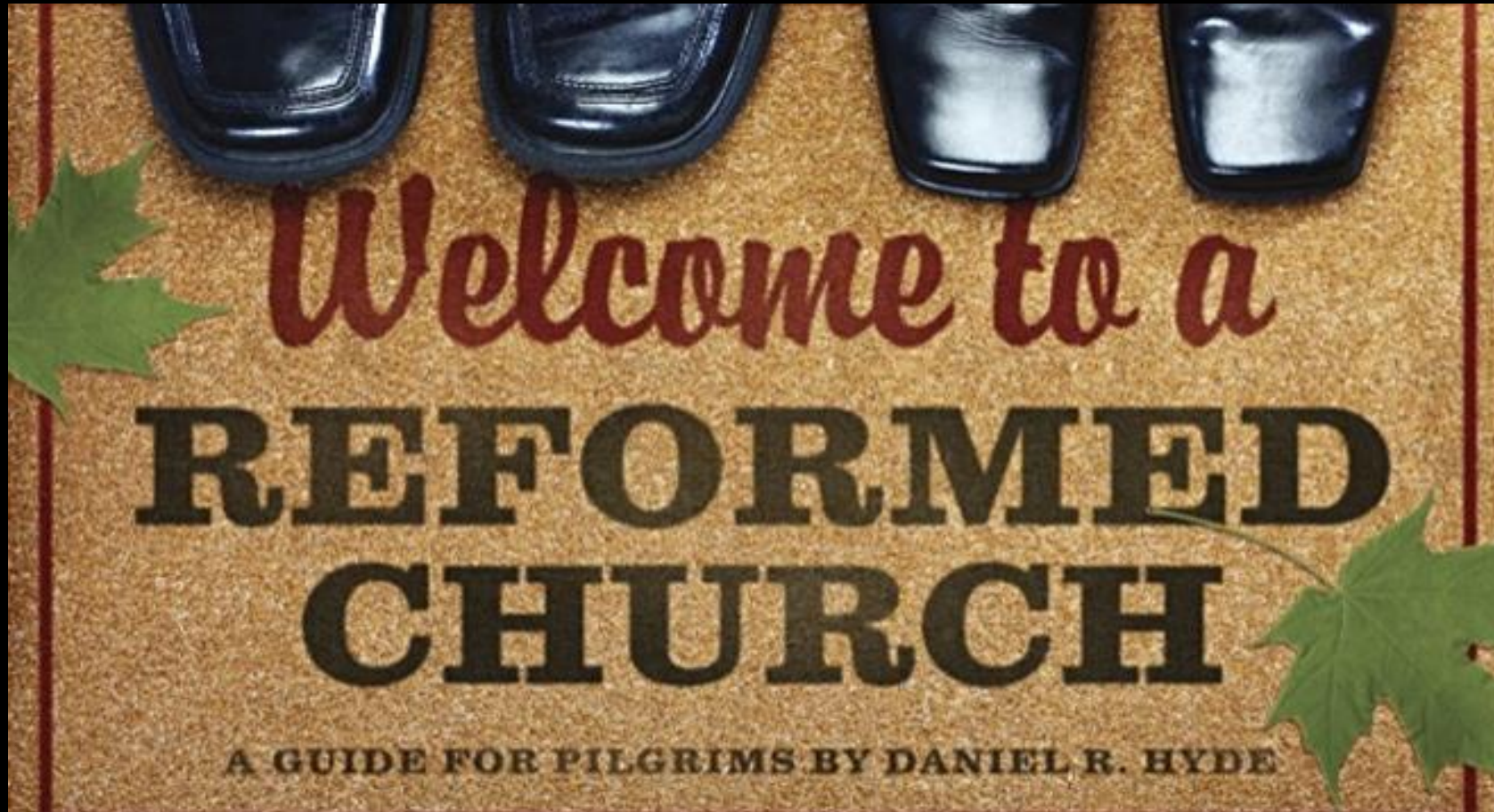

Definitive Sanctification

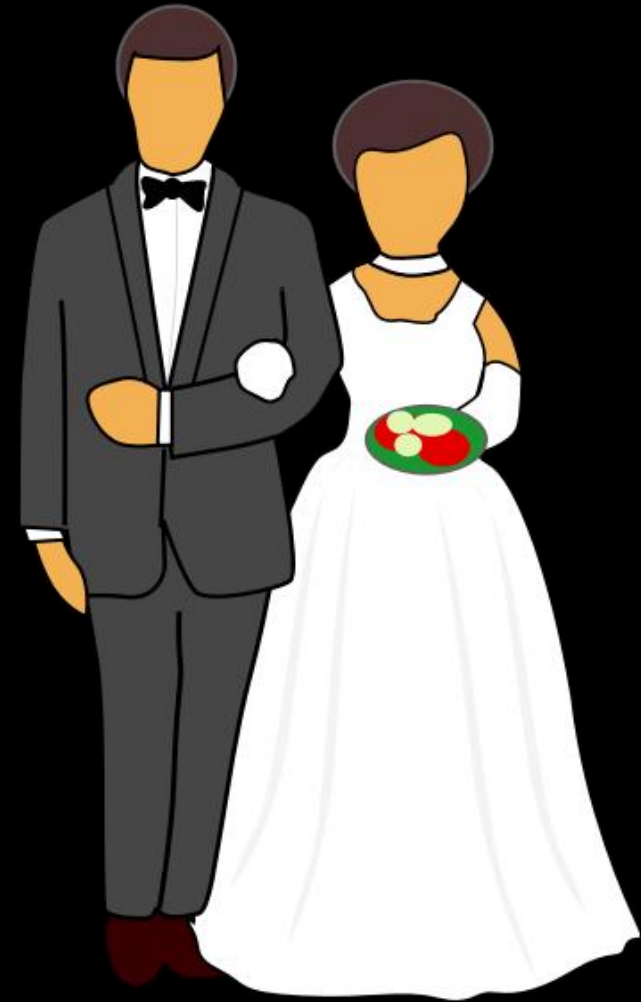
vs.

Progressive Sanctification

Definitive Sanctification >>>>>> leads to Progressive Sanctification:

Definitive or Positional Sanctification
involves a change in *status*

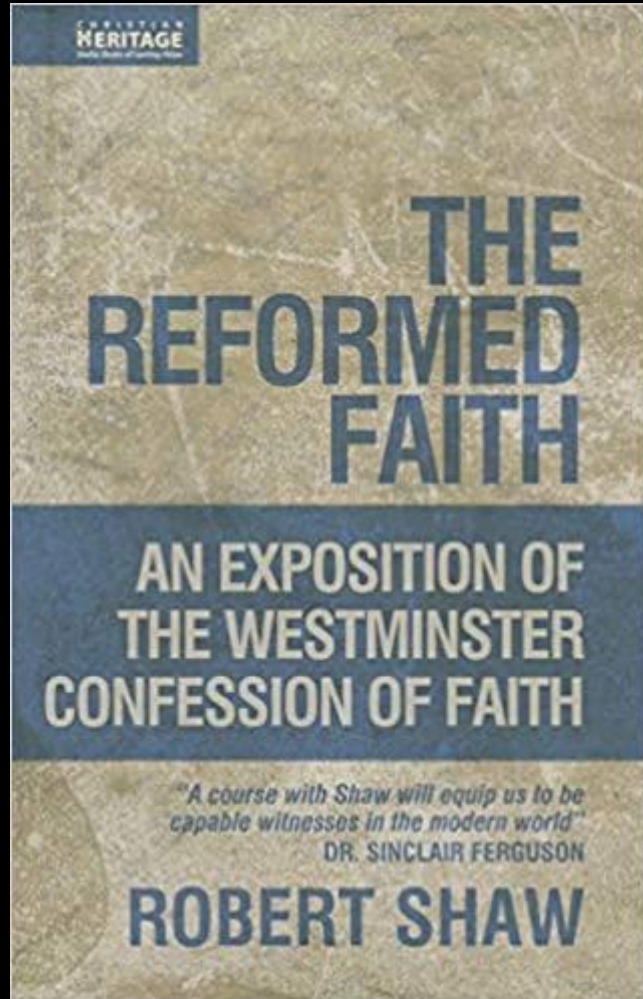
- 1 Corinthians 1:2

Progressive Sanctification:

WCF Q. 35: "Sanctification is the work of God's free grace, whereby we are renewed in the whole man after the image of God, and enabled more and more to die unto sin, and live unto righteousness."

“Justification is a relative change of state; sanctification is a real change of the whole man, soul, and body.” – Robert Shaw



Shaw explains how Justification and Sanctification differ in 4 ways:

1. Order
2. Matter
3. Form
4. Properties

The Law & Sanctification:

“The law no longer condemns us or enslaves us (as Christians); instead, it serves as a guide to lead us in a life of holiness before the Lord.” - Hyde

1. Moral Laws: Refers to everything God is and who we are to be. (10 commandments)
2. Ceremonial Laws: Sections of scripture that teach us about truth for God’s people, ultimately leading people to Christ. (Religious Feast Days in OT)
3. Judicial Laws: Punishments given to those who violated and transgressed the law.

I. Pursuing the Trinitarian Godlikeness:

1. Imitating the Character of God the Father (*1 Peter 1:14-16*)
2. Conforming to the image of the second person of the Godhead, Jesus Christ. (*Philippians 2:5-8*)
3. Submitting to the third person of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit (*Romans 8:5-6*)

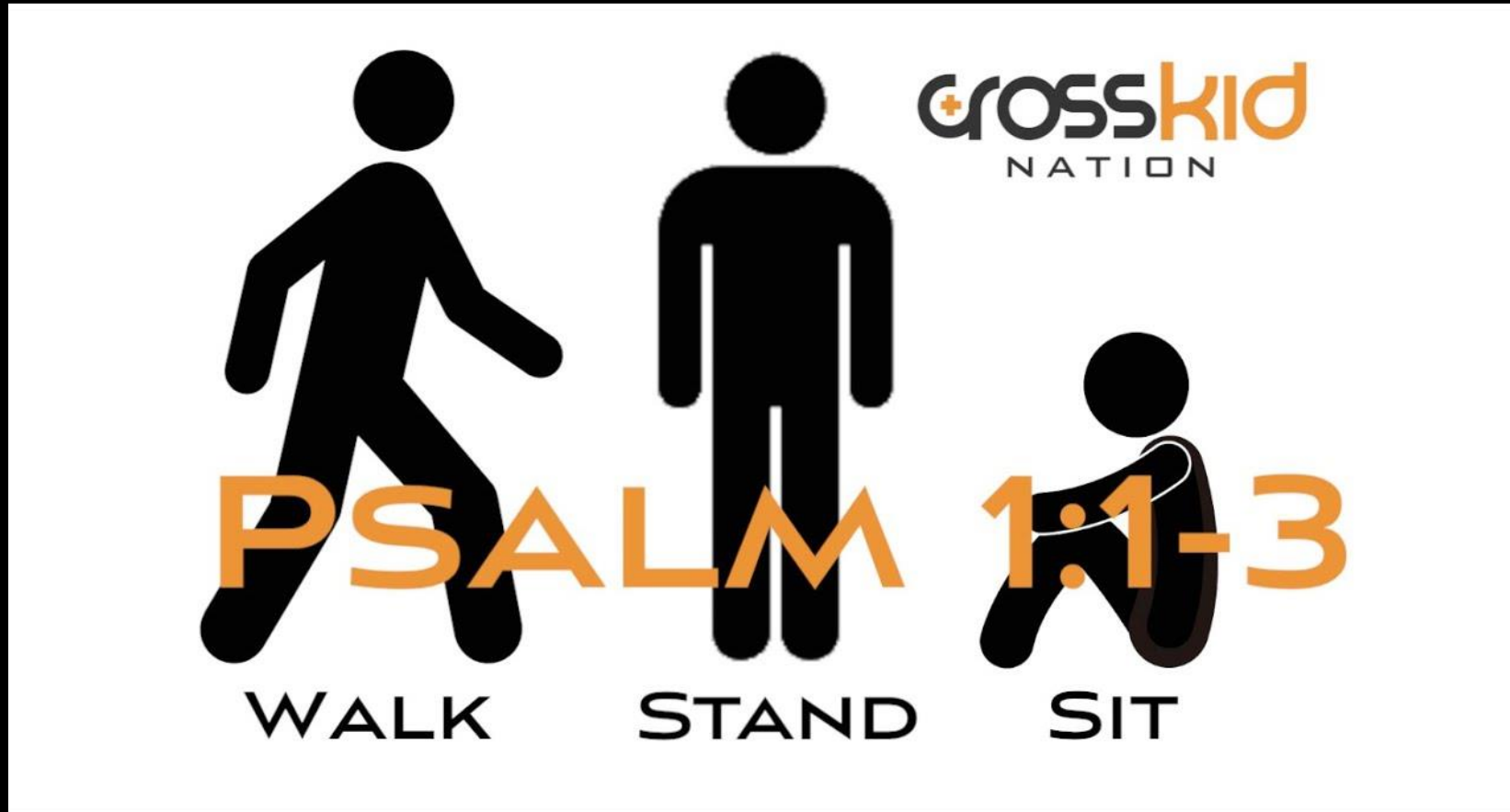
II. Mortifying Sin:
