I) Introduction

Who is the author of temptations and trials?

II) Command these stones to become bread (v. 2-4) "The lust of the flesh"

The devil tempts Jesus to distrust His Father's care

Jesus resists by quoting the Word of God

The devil will tempt us in our weak points

Resist Him with Scripture

III) Throw yourself down from the temple (v. 5-7) "The pride of life"

The devil tests Jesus' trust in the Word of God

Satan quotes the Scripture (Ps 91:11-12)

Jesus answers from the "whole counsel of God:"
Testing God is not trusting God

The devil will tempt us in our strengths

Do not rely on your strength, but in the Word

- IV) All these (kingdoms of the world) I will give you (v 8-11) "The lust of the eyes"
 - The devil tempts Jesus by offering Him a shortcut to accomplish his mission
 - The devil will tempt you by offering you shortcuts and compromises

What a real and mighty enemy we have in the devil

We must not count temptation a strange thing

The chief weapon we ought to use in resisting Satan is the Bible

Trust the Father's Voice at Jesus' Baptism instead of miraculous signs

Our Spiritual warfare is with a defeated enemy

What a sympathizing Savior the Lord Jesus is (Hebrews 2:17-18, 4:14-15)
