HEBREWS: The absolute greatness of Jesus as Son—Part 5

(So that God's people will not become complacent and compromise, but persevere)

Sermon: **Hebrews 4:9**

Jesus is greater in giving the rest that remains for God's people.

We see:

1. What *rest* is meant here.
2. There is a *rest* that is entered, and yet *remains*.
3. This *rest* is for *the people of God*, who are admonished about it.

The church is called to be a confessing church, that she may be,
the pillar and ground of the truth (1Tim. 3:15,16)

The Heidelberg Catechism

103. Q. What does God require in the **fourth commandment**?

A. First, that the ministry of the gospel and the schools be maintained[1] and that, especially on the day of rest, I diligently attend the church of God[2] to hear God's Word,[3] to use the sacraments,[4] to call publicly upon the LORD,[5] and to give Christian offerings for the poor. [6] Second, that all the days of my life I rest from my evil works, let the LORD work in me through His Holy Spirit, and so begin in this life the eternal sabbath. [7]

1. *I believe in God the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth.*

10. *The forgiveness of sins;*
11. *The resurrection of the body;*
12. *And the life everlasting. Amen.*

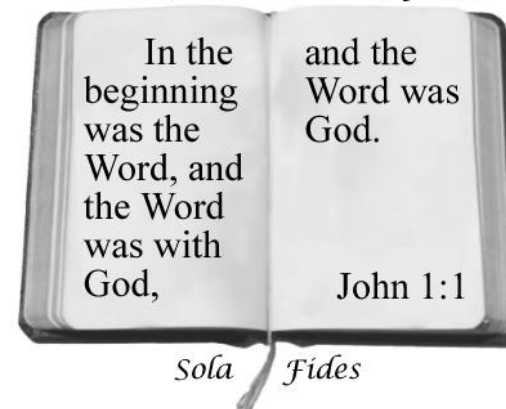

Questions for discussion

[Sermon: Hebrews 4:9]

1. What is the normal meaning of *rest*, and what is the *rest* in our text?
2. What about all the “unrest” in the world, does this *rest* speak of that? How does God use that “unrest”?
3. What truth does the Holy Spirit use to teach us about the *rest*?
(Note the beautiful truth of that *rest*!)
4. Given the truth (example from #3), how does that *rest* speak to us if we have believed in Jesus (v.10)?
5. What is the *rest* we enter into, and what is the *rest that remains*?
6. Who are *the people of God*, for whom there is a *rest that remains*?
7. Instead of focusing on our imaginations of the eternal rest, what ought we to focus on?
(What was the result of “old Israel” focusing on the rest ahead?)
