

- A. The life and worship of the early New Testament church was one of unity.
- B. Explaining this unity is that she was filled with the out-poured Spirit of Christ!

The Unity of the Spirit-Filled Church

I. Unity of Faith.

- A. The church's unity of faith was a unity in principle: the same God worked the same faith in the hearts of His people, by the same Spirit.

- B. This unity of faith was manifest in the same outward confession of faith.

II. Unity of Worship.

- A. On the basis of their common faith, believers came together in worship.

- B. Note what the elements of their worship did, and did not, include.

III. Unity of Life.

- A. United in faith and worship, the believers readily manifested the communion of saints.

- B. In these three ways, the church's unity served as a testimony of God's grace, which the unbelievers around could not help but note.
