Introduction

Has the LORD GOD's plan gone wrong because CHRIST was rejected by the very people who were prepared for HIM to come into this world through (the JEWS)?

We've seen how this Chapter has previously revealed that, as always, some OPEN THEIR HEARTS to GOD'S REVELATION while others HARDENED THEIR HEARTS! Yet if GOD ELECTS and SELECTS as HE did with both ISAAC and JACOB, does that mean HE'S being UNFAIR?

In *verses 14-18,* we see another stage in the developing argument for **GOD'S SOVEREIGNTY**, particularly as it deals with **ISRAEL**.

GOD'S RIGHT TO CHOOSE is seen not only in ABRAHAM'S children and grandchildren, it is seen elsewhere. Here in our text we see it operating in GOD'S dealings with the PHARAOH of EGYPT who stubbornly refused to heed GOD'S WORD and WARNINGS. Here we learn that the AUDACITY and REBELLION of man can never thwart the PURPOSES OF GOD. And we will see that GOD has a right to deal with the OBSTINATE and DEFIANT as HE so CHOOSES!

We should not think of GOD as being unfair though. GOD'S MERCY is far wider and higher than anyone dare hope, but no one is ENTITLED to it and no one can demand from GOD an accounting or the principles on which HE BESTOWS MERCY and GRACE nor that HE should BESTOW it differently than HE DOES! GOD'S MERCY and GRACE may impose conditions but they cannot be made subject to man's conditions. Understand though that GOD delights to show MERCY and has LAVISHED it upon mankind.

I. WE SEE THAT GOD'S CHOICES ARE NOT ARBITRARY! (Vs 14)

Here we see a question asking if there is **UNRIGHTEOUSNESS** with **GOD** over the **CHOICES HE** makes.

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i.e. "Does GOD ever make UNJUST CHOICES?"

In the immediate context, was **GOD UNJUST** in **CHOOSING ISAAC** over **ISHMAEL**, and **JACOB** over **ESAU**? (By the way, the question as it is asked implies a negative response!)

And we see **PAUL'S** emphatic response is, "**GOD FORBID**" *i.e. "Never!*" A lot of people have a real problem right here. They see **GOD** as being **UNFAIR** in acting outside of or before mankind has acted. They want to know how could **GOD** choose to **LOVE JACOB**, and **HATE ESAU** before they were even born?

The answer is simple. It is because GOD IS SOVEREIGN! The mystery is (as I heard the late Dr. J. Vernon McGee put it) is not that GOD HATED ESAU. The mystery is that GOD LOVED JACOB, and an even greater wonder is that HE LOVES ME, a sinner just like JACOB! (Remember JACOB was a CONNIVER!)

Did GOD choose correctly? Read your BIBLE and you'll see that ESAU wasn't interested in SPIRITUAL THINGS, but was attracted to CARNAL THINGS! Yes, GOD CHOSE CORRECTLY—HE ALWAYS DOES!

WE SEE THAT GOD'S CHOICES ARE NOT ARBITRARY ...

II. WE SEE THAT GOD'S CHOICES ARE MERCIFUL! (Vs 15-16)

Two arguments are made here to prove there is **NO INJUSTICE IN GOD!** The first is derived from the **SCRIPTURES** and the second is derived from the **UNCHANGING CHARACTER OF GOD WHO CANNOT BE UNRIGHTEOUS!**

Verse 15 reminds us that GOD has claimed in HIS WORD the PREROGATIVE OF DIVINE RIGHT.

It is **NOT UNJUST** for **GOD** to exercise a **SOVEREIGN'S RIGHT TO MAKE DECISIONS ACCORDING TO HIS JUSTICE!**

An example of GOD implementing HIS PREROGATIVE is found in HIS WORD TO MOSES *(Exodus 33:19)* which PAUL quotes here. As the SOVEREIGN GOD, HE has the RIGHT to SHOW MERCY to whomever HE CHOOSES! In fact, HE IS NOT UNDER OBLIGATION TO EXTEND MERCY TO ANYONE!

What was the context of **GOD** saying this? Well, this is shortly after the people of **ISRAEL** had **SINNED** by dancing around the golden calf and worshiping it at **MT. SINAI** while **MOSES** was on the mount receiving the **LAW OF GOD**! The people had **SINNED GRIEVOUSLY AGAINST GOD**! (*Exodus 32*)

If GOD had ACTED simply in JUSTICE, HE would have blotted out all HIS PEOPLE except MOSES and JOSHUA right then and there. But MOSES interceded for them! And instead of wholesale JUDGMENT, GOD allowed about 3000 men to lose their lives in the JUDGMENT dished out by the sons of LEVI and the LORD plagued the rest of the people on top of that. (*Details not given*)

In *Exodus 33:19*, we see MOSES interceding for the people before the LORD in the TABERNACLE and that is where the LORD proclaimed that "*I...will be gracious to whom I will be gracious, and will shew mercy on whom I will show mercy.*"

GOD'S MERCY of course was seen in **HIS** sparing a sinful nation. Why did **GOD** pardon them? Because **GOD IS MERCIFUL!** Look at *Exodus 34:5-9*!

GOD grants GRACIOUSLY and MERCIFULLY but only as HE CHOOSES TO GRANT!

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Now understand that **GOD** is not like a mad dictator saying **HE** can do whatever **HE** pleases. **HE** is revealing that **HIS** actions toward humanity will be true to **HIS CHARACTER OF BEING MERCIFUL, GRACIOUS, LONGSUFFERING,** and **ABUNDANT IN GOODNESS** and **TRUTH.** The **INTEGRITY OF GOD'S CHARACTER GOVERNS HIS ACTIONS.**

GOD'S FREEDOM and **MERCY** is advocated in these verses we are looking at. **GOD'S SUPERIOR POWER, HIS ABILITY TO EXECUTE WHAT HE DESIRES**, is everywhere acknowledged.

Man's fear, however, is that **GOD** will use **HIS POWER** arbitrarily and without regard to **HIS SUBJECTS**, or even against them. Everyone agrees that **GOD IS FREE**; but **IS HE JUST**?

Since the basis of **GOD'S DECISIONS** or **CHOICES** is **HIS MERCY**, *Romans 9:16* reveals that **MAN'S WILL** or **EFFORT** is not the supreme consideration.

None of mankind DESERVES or can EARN GOD'S MERCY! GOD'S MERCY DOES NOT DEPEND ON MAN'S WORTHINESS TO RECEIVE IT! Man does not need to EARN or DESERVE GOD'S MERCY. MERCY, like GRACE, stands above limited human worth and effort. (UNMERITED!)

GOD'S MERCY is FREE, because GOD IS <u>NOT</u> BOUND TO SHOW MERCY TO ANY! It is <u>NOT</u> the EXERCISE of MAN'S WILL or MAN'S STRIVING that COMPELS GOD to WITHHOLD HIS JUDGMENT, but rather it is HIS MERCY!

Titus 3:5—"Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but **ACCORDING TO HIS MERCY HE SAVED US**, by the washing of regeneration, and the renewing of the Holy Ghost."

Now, understand that our **HUMAN EFFORT** is a right response of our gratitude and commitment to **GOD** for **HIS GRACE IN CHRIST JESUS**, but it doesn't **MERIT GRACE**.

Cf. Ephesians 2:1-10

WE SEE THAT GOD'S CHOICES ARE NOT ARBITRARY... WE SEE THAT GOD'S CHOICES ARE MERCIFUL...

III. WE SEE THAT GOD'S CHOICES OVERRULE EVIL! (Vs. 17-18)

It was C. S. Lewis who stated that "there are only two possibilities in the universe. Either a man says to God, 'Thy will be done,' or God says to man, 'All right then. Your will be done.' If you choose to do your will in this life instead of God's will, then one day you will face God's justice."

What is the relation between GOD'S MERCY and HIS JUDGMENT? That is the issue *verses 17-18* deal with. MERCY and JUSTICE are not opposed to each other but work together.

The thought moves from **MOSES** to **PHARAOH**, the king of **EGYPT** at the time of the **EXODUS**. In *verse 17*, the **APOSTLE PAUL** presented his third historical illustration of the **SOVEREIGN LORD'S PURPOSE**.

[Note that this quotation is introduced with the words, "For the Scripture saith," in place of "thus saith the LORD," equating the WORDS of GOD with the WORDS of SCRIPTURE.]

This SCRIPTURE quotation comes from *Exodus 9:16*. This was spoken to the EGYPTIAN PHARAOH by the LORD through MOSES! The LORD says there, *"I raised thee up"* or I brought you onto the scene of history! SCRIPTURE is speaking a vivid reminder that it is GOD WHO RAISED PHARAOH UP!

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"*I raised thee up*" is not only a reference to **PHARAOH'S** emergence in history, but to **GOD'S PROVIDENCE** in sparing him up to that point!

PHARAOH DESERVED DEATH for his **OPPRESSION** and **HIS ARROGANT, STUBBORN PRIDE!** But his life would not be taken during the series of plagues, so that not only the full extent of his **HARDNESS OF HEART** might be evident but also that the **GREATNESS OF GOD IN THE DELIVERANCE OF HIS PEOPLE** might be more clearly evident.

Over and over again, **PHARAOH** was moved by the **PLAGUES** that the **LORD** sent on him and his people, only to revert, once the impact wore off, back to his **ARROGANT** attitude of **RESISTANCE** to the **LORD'S** demands.

Repeatedly, he **HARDENED HIS HEART** *(Exodus 5:2)* until finally **GOD HARDENED IT FOR HIM** *(Exodus 7:3)*. The history of **PHARAOH'S HEART-HARDENING** should be noted carefully, as should the **LORD'S** explanation of **HIS** actions.

GOD raised up PHARAOH in order that HIS POWER might be made known. GOD CAN BE GLORIFIED THROUGH THOSE WHO OPPOSE HIM AS WELL AS THROUGH THOSE WHO TRUST AND SERVE HIM! *Psalm 76:10–"Surely the wrath of man shall praise thee: The remainder of wrath shalt thou restrain."*

The LORD placed PHARAOH in his position of visibility so that when his HARD-HEARTEDNESS came into conflict with GOD'S PURPOSE, he would become an international illustration of the eventual outcome of OPPOSING GOD'S PURPOSES!

If **PHARAOH** had been born in obscurity, with no one knowing him, his **SIN** would have been neither lesser nor greater.

But the LORD placed this ARROGANT man in a position where his STUBBORN PRIDE and ADAMANT REFUSAL to CONSENT TO GOD'S WILL would not only lead to his own downfall, but also to a WORLDWIDE DEMONSTRATION of GOD'S DIVINE POWER.

GOD'S FREEDOM TO SO ACT is a **RIGHT** of **HIS SOVEREIGNTY!**

The Book of **EXODUS** shows us that **PHARAOH** pitted himself, not just against **MOSES**, but against **GOD!** It also shows that the **LORD** used **PHARAOH'S HARDNESS** as an opportunity to **DEMONSTRATE HIS GLORY!**

The effect of **PHARAOH'S HOSTILITY**, accomplished the opposite of what he intended! It resulted in the **LIBERATION** of the **ISRAELITES**. Through **PHARAOH'S RESISTANCE**, **GOD'S POWER WAS DEMONSTRATED** as **HE** freed the **ISRAELITES** from under **PHARAOH'S HAND**. *(Romans 9:22)*

The LORD'S name was proclaimed in the earth as other nations heard about it and were awed! *(Exodus 15:14-16; Joshua 2:10-11; 9:9; 1 Samuel 4:8)*

Now Verse 18 of our text is the climatic conclusion of the argument.

Understand that as we read the account of the **HARDENING** of **PHARAOH'S** heart, sometimes it was attributed to the **LORD**, and other times it was attributed to **PHARAOH** himself. In **EXODUS**, **SCRIPTURE** records **TWENTY TIMES** when **PHARAOH'S HEART WAS HARDENED**!

TEN of those times, **GOD HARDENED HIS HEART** and **TEN** of those times **PHARAOH HARDENED IT HIMSELF!**

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Understand, that when GOD HARDENED PHARAOH'S HEART, HE was only CONFIRMING PHARAOH'S OWN DECISION!

GOD HARDENS whom HE CHOOSES (lit. "make stubborn"; Exodus 4:21; 7:3; 9:12; 10:27; 14:4, 8; 14:17)! That emphasizes the FREEDOM OF GOD'S ACTION! Because of GOD'S PROPOSAL, PHARAOH HARDENED HIS HEART (Exodus 7:13-14, 22; 8:15, 19, 32; 9:7, 34-35). All this shows that GOD CHOOSES and WORKS SOVEREIGNLY, but NOT ARBITRARILY! Yet PHARAOH was responsible for his actions.

PHARAOH being **STUBBORN** in his heart is evidence of both his **UNBELIEF** and his **REBELLION**. Remember how we saw in *Romans 1* that **GOD** deals with those who **REJECT HIS REVELATION** of **HIMSELF** in **CREATION** and **HISTORY** by **GIVING THEM OVER** to move into still greater excesses of **SIN** and its **CONSEQUENCES**!

Conclusion

GOD DOES NOT ACT UNJUSTLY IN HIS SOVEREIGN CHOICES! Yet HE has claimed HIS RIGHT and FREEDOM in HIS WORD to act not only in JUSTICE, but also in MERCY. Throughout history GOD has often temporally employed SEVERE MEASURES in order to SERVE HIS GRACIOUS ENDS, which is the SALVATION OF MEN.

The wonder is not that some are **SAVED** and others are not, but that any body is **SAVED** at all. For we all **DESERVE** nothing from **GOD** but **JUDGMENT.** But thankfully **GOD** is a **GOD OF MERCY! HE** made a **PLAN** and a **WAY of SALVATION...IN CHRIST!**

DON'T HARDEN YOUR HEART AGAINST THE REVEALED WILL OF GOD IN CHRIST! Heed HIS WORD and YIELD TO HIS SOVEREIGN POWER AND PURPOSE! If you remain LOST, the blame is yours, but all those who are SAVED, all the credit goes to GOD! GOD shows HIS MERCY toward those WHO TRUST CHRIST JESUS!
