Introduction

When Paul arrived at Corinth he was physically weak, weary, gripped by fear, in distress, and despondent.

"I was with you in weakness and in fear and much trembling," 1 Corinthians 2:3.

God often calls his ministers to a life of suffering and aloneness. But there is good purpose in this.

Paul enters Corinth alone.

Comfort and encouragement from his colleagues.

Jesus sees the suffering of His servant. Paul's fear has gripped him to the point of silence.

When the body is battered and fatigued, the mind is vulnerable and often invaded with terrors and negative, discouraging thoughts that are relentless if not confronted by truth.
