Daniel 1

1:1 Setting the scene

1:1 In the third year of the reign of Jehoiakim king of Judah

605 BC. (Jer 25:1; 2 Ki 24:1; 2 Ch 36:5-8)

King Nebuchadnezzar ruled Babylon from ca. 605-562 B.C.

First of three deportations

1:2 A Surprising introduction

Dan 1:2 And the Lord gave Jehoiakim king of Judah into his hand, with some of the vessels of the house of God. And he brought them to the land of Shinar, to the house of his god, and placed the vessels in the treasury of his god.

1:2 He did what?

God gave... (Jer 25)

1:3-7 Living for God in a hostile world

1:3-4 Trained as ambassadors, held as hostages

1:5 A University degree!

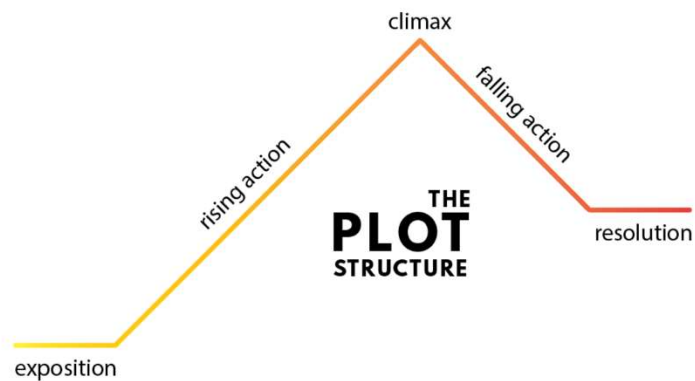
1:6 Hope for Israel – the sons of Judah

1:7 What's in a name?

In Hebrew Daniel means "God is my judge"; Hananiah means "the Lord is gracious"; Mishael means "who is what God is?"; Azariah means "the Lord has helped."

1:8 Daniel resolved not to defile himself with the kings food
Perhaps unclean foods, perhaps sacrificed to idols, reason unclear.
What is clear – Daniel wants to honor God in whatever way is left to him
He asks permission

2:10-11 The heart of the matter ""There is not a man on earth who can meet the king's demand, for no great and powerful king has asked such a thing of any magician or

enchanter or Chaldean. The thing that the king asks is difficult, and no one can show it to the king except the gods, whose dwelling is not with flesh.”

2:14-16 Prudence and Discretion

2:17-18 A simple prayer for mercy

2:19-23 A revelation of God!

20 wisdom and might

21 times and seasons

Removes and sets up kings

Gives wisdom and knowledge

22 reveals deep and hidden things

Knows what is in the darkness, light dwells with him

23 To you, O God of my fathers, I give thanks and praise, for you have given me wisdom and might, and have now made known to me what we asked of you, for you have made known to us the king's matter.”

Missing the point

Don't assume chronology in apocalyptic visions!

As you looked, a stone was cut out by no human hand, and it struck the image on its feet of iron and clay, and broke them in pieces. Why was Nebuchadnezzar so troubled by the dream?

Dan 2:37-38 You, O king, the king of kings, to whom the God of heaven has given the kingdom, the power, and the might, and the glory, (38) and into whose hand he has given, wherever they dwell, the children of man, the beasts of the field, and the birds of the heavens, making you rule over them all—you are the head of gold.

2:46-49 The resolution

46 Nebuchadnezzar still doesn't get it

47 At least he gets something

48-49 An answered prayer, and more

Daniel 3: Nebuchadnezzar's Golden Image

3:1 The King really doesn't get it!

3:2-7 Setting the scene: Ridiculous pomp and ceremony

the satraps, the prefects, and the governors, the counselors, the treasurers, the justices, the magistrates, and all the officials

the sound of the horn, pipe, lyre, trigon, harp, bagpipe, and every kind of music

3:8-12 An opportunity for a take-down

3:10 The absurdity continues

3:12 The real accusation – “These men, O king, pay no attention to you”

3:13-15 An absurd king

Who is the god who will deliver you out of my hands?

- Nebuchadnezzar should already know the answer to his own question

3:16 Real wisdom begins with faith

16 You should know better!

17 Our God can

Our God will

18 But if not! We would rather die than compromise our relationship with God!

3:19-23 An angry king – 7 times hotter!

3:24-27 An unexpected result

The comedy subsides!

No smell of smoke!

3:27-28 Another happy ending

(But the king still doesn't get it)

Three stories of faith

1. God gives
2. God saves

Three stories of living for God in a hostile world

2. Seek God in your need
3. Trust God with your life
