The Nature of Our Unity: The Trinity.

- Unified in Character. Ephesians 4:4-6.
- Unified in Love. John 17:26; Matthew 22:34-40; John 13:31:34-35.
- Unified in Purpose. 2 Corinthians 5:15; Matthew 28:18-20.
- Unified in Destiny. John 17:24; Romans 8:29.
