## John 13:12-17 SERVANTS: NOT GREATER THAN THE LORD

- I. The significant setting.
  - A. Jesus sent Peter and John to make ready the Passover (Luke 22:7ff).
  - B. In the evening Jesus with the other ten arrived at the room (Mark 14:17) travelling a couple miles over dusty roads.
  - C. On the way the disciples argued among themselves who was the greatest (Luke 22:24-30).
- II. The real washing [we must see this truth before we will understand the example].
  - A. Without a word, Jesus poured water in the basin, took a towel and went from one to another, washing their feet.
  - B. Jesus used this as the occasion to instruct concerning His real purpose in coming: His love cleanses them from their sin.
  - C. Jesus pointed out to Peter that by refusing the sign, Peter was refusing the reality (8b).
    - 1. Jesus speaks to the picture (the foot washing) and to the reality (the thorough washing of regeneration).
    - 2. And they are clean, "but not all" (10,11), i.e., not all of them might be saved, though they have the sign same true: baptism
- III. Jesus drove the point home after He finished.
  - A. They all knew that He was the Mater and Lord, and they spoke of Him as such (13).
  - B. To believe in the foot-washing-Jesus is to follow His example.
    - 1. They must be ready to render to each other whatever service is needful, no matter how lowly it may seem (14).
    - 2. Rank in Jesus's kingdom comes in the willingness to serve.
  - C. The washing of dirty, sweaty, smelly feet is a lesson, demonstrating Jesus loving us to the end (1).
  - D. Jesus concludes by declaring of what happiness consists.
