1 John 2:24-3:3

I. The Anointing and Abiding 2:20-26

- A. Anointed (chrisma) -- 2:20
 - 1. The Greek word is *chrisma* (not charisma = gift or gifted).

While chrisma is used only twice -- A close relative word is found in **Luke 4:18** -- "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me; he has **appointed me** to preach the good news to the poor".

2. Who gave them this anointing?

The Holy One.

John 6:69 – the disciples said to Jesus "We have come to believe and know that you are **the Holy One** of God."

B. Let that Knowledge Abide in you -- v. 24-25

What a glorious promise -- eternal Life!

II. Abide in Christ 2:27-29

A. Knowing the Truth -- v. 27

- 1. The Anointing you received from Him abides in you.
- 2. You have no need for anyone to teach you

Colin Kruse writes, "The reference to **all things** here needs to be understood in context, in which the subject under discussion is the denial that Jesus is the Christ, God's Son come in the flesh... Thus, the thrust of this verse is that as the Holy Spirit has taught them the truth about Jesus Christ, so the readers are to remain in Him (Christ)."
