- 1) Gospel is not novel with the Apostles
- 2) Abraham is the father of the "people" of God
- 3) Abraham is presented uniquely as the "believer"

- c. Response
  - Obedience of faith

- a. Promise Amplified
  - Forever Land
  - Countless Seed
- b. Instruction
  - Walk about the Land
- c. Response
  - Obedience of faith
  - Worship

# 3) Gen 15:1-7

- a. Promise Restated
  - Shield / Reward
  - Seed / Land
- b. Instruction
  - -----
- c. Response
  - Believed >> God reckoned him righteous

# 4) Gen 17:1-11

- a. Promise Expanded
  - Father of Nations
  - Everlasting Covenant with Seed
  - Seed will come from you AND Sarah
- b. Instruction
  - Circumcise throughout generations
- c. Response
  - Obedience of faith

## 5) Gen 22:1-18 - The Test

- a. Instruction
  - Sacrifice only son
- b. Response
  - Obedience of faith
- c. Promise Reiterated
  - Blessed / Blessing
  - Great Name
  - Seed
