Introduction

- The lost IRS Form 4361
- Pharisees and Scribes muttering about Jesus' associations with sinners
 - Refused to believe the message themselves
 - Rejected the messenger and sought to destroy Jesus through false accusations.
 - Misunderstood Jesus' mission
 - Misread the heart of God

Lost Sheep

A. Prelude to the Parables

- 1. Three in One—15:3
- 2. Quote from Shepard's book, The Christ of the Gospels.
- 3. Deals primarily with the relationship between a loving God and lost man, not between God and a backslidden Christian.

B. Parable of the "Lost Sheep"—Luke 15:4-7

- 1. The Parable TOLD
 - a. The nature of sheep
 - b. The response of a "good" shepherd

2. The Parable UNFOLDED

- a. The Pharisees should have known from Scripture
 - 1) Like sheep, all mankind has strayed from God—Isa. 53:6
 - 2) Like a good shepherd, God seeks the lost—Ezek. 34:11-16
 - 3) Like a good shepherd, God lovingly cares for his own—Isaiah 40:11
- b. The Pharisees knew nothing of God's COMPASSIONATE HEART
 - 1) God compassionately seeks the lost—Exod. 34:16
 - 2) The Pharisees as "bad" shepherds—Ezek. 34:2-8
 - 3) Jesus' indictment of them Matthew 23:4, 11-14
 - 4) In contrast, Jesus as the "Good" shepherd—Mt. 9:36; Lk. 4:18-19; 19:10
- C. The Pharisees knew nothing of God's CELEBRATORY HEART
 - 1) Believed that God rejoiced in death of wicked
 - 2) Jesus celebrated the conversions of lost sinners—Mt. 7; Lk. 19
 - 3) **TWIST**: More joy over sinner who repents then over those who think they are righteous who do not repent!
