The Heidelberg Catechism

- <u>**62. Q.**</u> But why can our good works not be our righteousness before God, or at least a part of it?
- A. Because the righteousness which can stand before God's judgment must be absolutely perfect and in complete agreement with the law of God,[1] whereas even our best works in this life are all imperfect and defiled with sin.[2]

[1] Deut. 27:26; Gal. 3:10. [2] Is. 64:6.

- **63. Q.** But do our good works earn nothing, even though God promises to reward them in this life and the next?[1]
- <u>A.</u> This reward is not earned; it is a gift of grace.[2] [1] Matt. 5:12; Heb. 11:6. [2] Luke 17:10; II Tim. 4:7, 8.
- **64. Q.** Does this teaching not make people careless and wicked?
- <u>A.</u> No. It is impossible that those grafted into Christ by true faith should not bring forth fruits of thankfulness.[1]


