I BELIEVE JESUS SUFFERED

- I. That He Suffered II. Why He Suffered III. For What He Suffered
- A. Jesus suffered all His life (2:10; Psalm 22:1,6,14-18; 69:8; Isa. 53:3,4).
- 1. He suffered physically.
- 2. He suffered in His soul (John 12:27; Luke 22:44; Matt. 26:37,38).
- B. Three things about His suffering.
- 1. One, His suffering was not an accident, but was a determined and deliberate act of God (Acts 2:23; Rev. 13:8).
- 2. Two, God inflicted the pain on Him, for He was "smitten of God" (Isa. 53:4,6,10).
- 3. Three, His suffering was voluntary, for He humbled Himself and became obedient unto death (Phil. 2:8).
- II. Why did Jesus suffer? Not to be a martyr for his principles, nor merely to be an example.
- A. The purpose of Jesus' suffering was to make payment for sin; He gave the sacrifice which made satisfaction.
- B. This is because He suffered as a substitute for others (Isa. 53:6).
- 1. His suffering was definite in its purpose and in its effect (the sheep were actually delivered).
- 2. His substitution is the greatest of all truths; no better news than to hear the Savior bore the punishment in my place.
- C.His death was necessary, as indicated by the fact that His death was by crucifixion.
- 1. He was cursed of God, separated and driven out of the fellowship of God (Gal. 3:13).
- 2. In His suffering Jesus was never disobedient; in fact, we read that He "learned obedience" (8).
- III. For what did Jesus suffer?
- A. In Jesus' suffering see the greatness of the love and mercy of God for me.

B. Believe that His suffering actually atoned, made real and full payment (John 10: 28; I Peter 2:24; Col. 1:21,22).

C.So I might learn the horrible nature of my sin as I see what Jesus had to suffer because of my sin.
