 - b. It is inspired by God and therefore without error – 2 Timothy 3:16
 - c. It is a supernatural & spiritual book – 2 Peter 1:20-21
 - d. It is the standard of truth – John 17:17; Psalm 119:128, 137, 142, 144, 151, 160
 - e. It is eternal – Matthew 24:35, Mark 13:31, Luke 21:33, Psalm 119:89, 152
- III. Observation – Basic characteristics about the student**
 - a. The Holy Spirit is necessary to understand the Bible – 1 Corinthians 1:17-25, 2:4-14, John 14:26, 16:5-13
