The Dispute in Council Acts 15

- 1. The dispute parties
  - A. The Pharisees advocated faith <u>plus</u> Old Testament <u>works</u> for salvation
  - B. Paul and Barnabas taught salvation by faith alone.
- 2. The council debate
  - A. Peter: God accepted the Gentiles by faith alone, as evidenced by the giving of the Holy Spirit.
  - B. Paul and Barnabas: God accepted the Gentiles by faith alone, as witnessed by miracles.
  - C. James: God accepted the Gentiles by faith alone, as witnessed by <u>Scripture</u>.
- 3. The resolution: The resolution of the council rejected the idea that believers had to become Jewish, or to work for salvation. But it demanded the Gentiles <u>respect</u> the beliefs of the Jews, and that they leave <u>idolatry</u>.
