Sunday, July 21, 2019 God is My Salvation – Isaiah 40. A Very Far Off Land – <u>Isa. 33:1-24</u>

Intro: <u>2 Kings 18:13-37</u> – Hezekiah offers to pay Assyria off, they accept, but then still advance to attack, promising peace, provision, and relocation to a good land and new life.

- I. The Sixth Woe vs. 1-6
 - A. Destroyers and Deceivers (vs. 1) (Quote 1) any means to conquer
 - B. God's People Cry Out (vs. 2-5)
 - 1. When pressed, the church prays Acts 12:5
 - 2. O LORD, be gracious, we wait, be our strength and salvation
 - 3. When You answer the thunder of Your voice people flee and nations are scattered
 - 4. When the Lord stands up Psa. 35:1-3; Job 41:8-11
 - a. The battle is over before it starts Rev. 19:19-20
 - b. The Lord IS raised up <u>Psa. 47:2; 92:8; 97:9; 113:4</u> He proves Himself to be high above God rising up in itself is nothing remarkable, it expresses what has always been true but now His people will be aware!
 - c. He will fill Zion with justice and righteousness
 - C. A Sure Foundation (vs. 6) <u>Psa. 111:10; 128:1; Prov. 1:7; 2:5; 8:13; 14:26</u>
 - 1. Divine Resources provide stability in times of distress
 - 2. Wisdom for true guidance
 - 3. Knowledge of the truth
 - 4. The fear of the Lord is the key to the storehouse of salvation
- II. Judgment of the Peoples vs. 7-12
 - A. Ineffective Human Effort (vs. 7-9)
 - 1. Appealing to Egypt and bribing Assyria are futile
 - 2. Those trying to find peace are duped
 - 3. The earth mourns and the landscape is withered (Quote 2)
 - B. Now! Now! Now! (vs. 10)
 - C. Sowing and Reaping (vs. 11-12) (When God stands up, three things happen)
 - 1. Sin's Birth the inevitable outcome of past decisions they conceived plans without God (chaff) and now give birth (achievements are stubble)
 - 2. Sin Boomerangs sinners cause their own doom, devoured by their own breath/spirit
 - 3. Sinners Burned punishment, shall be burned as with lime/whitewashing
 - 4. Sin ruins the life of the sinner and stirs up the wrath of God Gal. 6:7-8
- III. Hear and See vs. 13-24
 - A. Zion's People (vs. 13-16)
 - 1. Hear: a universal proclamation what God does for His people has world-wide significance
 - 2. Sinners fear, hypocrites are terrorized
 - 3. The question to ask: Who can dwell together with this devouring fire?
 - 4. The answer Psalm 15; 24
 - a. He who walks righteously
 - b. He who speaks uprightly
 - c. Despises wicked gain and bribes
 - d. Guards his ears and eyes against anything bringing guilt before God or hurt to others
 - e. He will dwell on high finding refuge and provision in the Lord Rock, Bread, Water

- B. Zion's King (vs. 17-24)
 - 1. See: the King in His beauty (excellence)
 - 2. See: the land that is very far off Heb. 11:9-10
 - 3. Hearts will ponder the terror of the past, the former conditions
 - 4. Not see: the enemy disappears
 - 5. Look! See Zion! <u>Heb. 11:3</u>
 - a. A quiet home peace
 - b. A permanent Tabernacle the pilgrimage complete
 - c. The Lord's presence in power
 - d. Freedom from war ships
 - e. The Lord is King, Judge, Lawgiver, Savior
 - f. The wounded ship of Israel loose tackle, weak mast, no sail takes the spoil!
 - g. The victory has been won, not by them, but for them
 - 6. The comfort of the gospel of the Kingdom (Quote 3)
 - a. No sickness or sin
 - b. No physical or spiritual malady

Quote 1 – "The Lord's perfect management of human affairs guarantees that for every trickster there is a trickster to outdo him, until in the end all alike perish in their cleverness."

Quote 2 – Motyer: "The start of sinful people's corruption of God's fair earth was as small as the first weed, but its end is a withered world."

Quote 3 – Young: "The grounds for peace, security, and blessedness that will come upon God's people – their iniquity has been lifted up from them, held no longer against them. They are forgiven."
