Make Room in Your Hearts
(7:2-9)

His Appeal (v.2a)

Make room in your hearts for us.

His Conscience Toward Them (v.2b)

We have *wronged* no one,
we have *corrupted* no one,
we have *taken advantage* of no one.

His Joy in Them (v.3-4)

I do not say this *to condemn* you,
for I said before that you are in our hearts,
to die together and to live together.

I am acting with *great boldness* toward you;
I have great *pride* in you;
I am filled with *comfort*.

In all our affliction,
I am *overflowing with joy*.

His Comfort in Them (v.5-7)

For even when we came into Macedonia,
 our bodies had no rest,
 but we were afflicted at every turn
 —fighting without and fear within.

But God, who *comforts* the downcast,
 comforted us by the coming of *Titus*,
 and not only by his coming
 but also by the comfort
 with which he was comforted *by you*,
 as he told us of your *longing*, your *mourning*,
 your *zeal* for me, so that I *rejoiced* still more.

His Grief to Them (v.8-9)

For even if I made you *grieve* with my letter,
 I *do not* regret it
 —though *I did* regret it,
 for I see that that letter grieved you,
 though only for a while.

As it is, I rejoice, not because you were grieved,
 but because you were grieved *into repenting*.

For you felt a *godly* grief,
 so that you suffered *no loss* through us.
