To the chief Musician, ^cMaschil, for the sons of Korah.
 As the hart panteth after the water brooks, so panteth my soul after thee, O God.
 2 My soul thirsteth for God, for the living God: when shall I come and appear before God?
 3 My tears have been my meat day and night, while ^ethey continually say unto me, Where is thy God?
 4 When I remember these things, I pour out my soul in me: for I had gone with the multitude, I went with them to the house of God with the voice of joy and praise, with a multitude that kept holyday.
 5 Why art thou cast down, O my soul? and why art thou disquieted in me? hope thou in God: for I shall yet praise him for the help of his countenance.
 6 O my God, my soul is cast down within me: therefore will I remember thee from the land of Jordan, and of the Hermonites, from the hill ^kMizar.
 7 Deep calleth unto deep at the noise of thy waterspouts: all thy waves and thy billows are gone over me.
 8 Yet the LORD will command his lovingkindness in the daytime, and in the night his song shall be with me, and my prayer unto the God of my life.
