Sermon: **Philippians 3:7-11**

The incomparable glory of knowing Jesus Christ.

This means:

1. ...a new view of my natural "old self" (my *flesh*) vv. 7,8.
2. ...receiving, by faith, a righteousness that is apart from me, v.9.
3. ...personally experiencing Christ transforming my life, v. 10.
4. ...humbly longing for the ultimate goal of perfect glory, v. 11.

The Westminster Confession of Faith

Chapter 16—Of Good Works

WCF 16.4 They who, in their obedience, attain to the greatest height which is possible in this life, are so far from being able to supererogate, and to do more than God requires, as that they fall short of much which in duty they are bound to do.(1)

WCF 16.5 We cannot, by our best works, merit pardon of sin, or eternal life, at the hand of God, by reason of the great disproportion that is between them and the glory to come, and the infinite distance that is between us and God, whom by them, we can neither profit nor satisfy for the debt of our former sins;(1) but when we have done all we can, we have done but our duty, and are unprofitable servants;(2) and because, as they are good, they proceed from His Spirit;(3) and as they are wrought by us, they are defiled, and mixed with so much weakness and imperfection, that they cannot endure the severity of God's judgment.(4)

WCF 16.6 Notwithstanding, the persons of believers being accepted through Christ, their good works also are accepted in Him;(1) not as though they were in this life wholly unblameable and unreprovable in God's sight;(2) but that He, looking upon them in His Son, is pleased to accept and reward that which is sincere, although accompanied with many weaknesses and imperfections.(3)

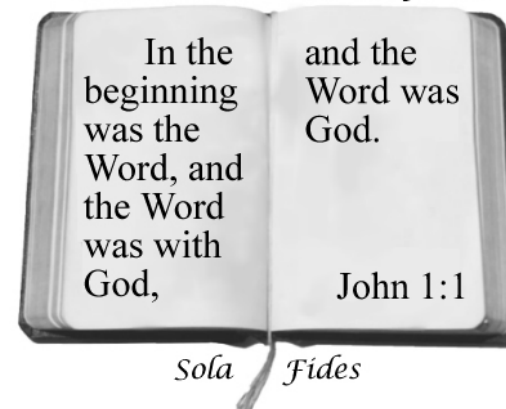
