

Faithful giving:

I. Provokes – "your zeal has provoked very many" (vs. 1-2)

Provoking:

- A. Ministry "For as touching ministering to the saints"
- **B.** Mindset "For I know the forwardness of your mind"
- C. Motivation "Your zeal hath provoked"
- II. Prepares "find you unprepared" (vs. 3-4)

Preparing that has the power to:

- A. Employ "Yet have I sent the brethren"
- B. Encourage "boasting of you should be in vain"
- C. Embarrass "that we ... should be ashamed"
- III. Performs "that the same might be ready" (vs. 5)

Performing what is:

- A. Promised "make up beforehand your bounty"
- B. Prescribed -"whereof you had notice beforehand"
- C. Plentiful "as a matter of bounty and not as of covetousness"
