Romans 15:1-13 (ESV)

1 We who are strong have an obligation to bear with the failings of the weak, and not to please ourselves. 2 Let each of us please his neighbor for his good, to build him up. 3 For Christ did not please himself, but as it is written, "The reproaches of those who reproached you fell on me." 4 For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, that through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope. 5 May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to live in such harmony with one another, in accord with Christ Jesus, 6 that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

7 Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God. 8 For I tell you that Christ became a servant to the circumcised to show God's truthfulness, in order to confirm the promises given to the patriarchs, 9 and in order that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. As it is written,

"Therefore I will praise you among the Gentiles,

and sing to your name."

10 And again it is said,

"Rejoice, O Gentiles, with his people."

11 And again,

"Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles, and let all the peoples extol him."

12 And again Isaiah says,

"The root of Jesse will come, even he who arises to rule the Gentiles; in him will the Gentiles hope."

13 May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope.

Pleasing > setting aside our to do what is best for others
Neighbor > reminds us that bearing with the weak is
For Christ > the ultimate "strong" one sacrificed himself to build up the weak ones –
Scriptures > the channel of God's endurance and encouragement to us as they show us
Hope for Sacrificial Love > we need hope that it really
Christ > reminds us to see ourselves as ones by God, not to do our will and get our way, but to serve for the glory of God
One Voice > Unified is the ultimate goal of unity
In Accord With > is the point of unity, not our opinions
<pre>Welcome > if we want to God, then we follow Christ's example of welcoming us so that God would be glorified Servant > exactly what the passage is calling to do</pre>
to us
Gentile Praise > Christ served Jew and Gentile, welcoming them so that they might praise God together for His
Hope, Praise, and Glory > Hearts filled with hope are hearts filled with praise: glorifies God
Hearts filled with hope are hearts with to serve and welcome one another despite differences (verses 1-4).
Hearts filled with the hope join together in unified praise to the glory of God.
