Mark 15:33-37 — "The Violence of Calvary: Cursed & Forsaken by God!"

Not all the vials of judgment that have or shall be poured out upon the wicked world, nor the flaming furnace of a sinner's conscience, nor the irreversible sentence pronounced against the rebellious demons, nor the groans of the damned creatures – give such a demonstration of God's hatred of sin – as the wrath of God let loose upon His Son! Never did divine holiness appear more beautiful and lovely than at the time our Savior's countenance was most marred in the midst of His dying groans – when God had turned His smiling face from Him, and thrust His sharp knife into His heart, which forced that terrible cry from Him, "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me!" (Stephen Charnock)

Christ exhausted the cup of God's wrath. For all who trust in Him there is nothing more in the cup. It is empty. (Jerry Bridges)

The word "propitiation" means this: Jesus fully satisfied the just anger of God for people like you by dying in your place, taking on himself all the wrath you deserve. We learn about this in Romans 3:24-25 and Hebrews 2:17. God's just fury, indignation and anger for sins were poured out on Christ for every sinful person who will come to him by faith. (Jim Elliff)

GOD is VIOLENTLY opposed to sin!

GOD is VORACIOUSLY committed to his Elect!

GOD is PASSIONATELY consumed with His glory!

GOD is UNSWERVINGLY devoted to His redemptive plan!

Background to Mark 15:

- v.25 = it is the 3rd hour when they crucified him (9AM roman time)
- v.33 = when the 6th hour came (12Noon) darkness came over the land
- v.34 = at the 9th hour (3pm) Jesus cried out: "my God my God..."
- v.42 = when evening had come = Joseph of Arimathea came to get the body (4-5pm)

THESIS — in Mark 15, we learn what God did for your salvation! What God did to the Son was violent.

- 1. **PRESENCE** OF GOD in judgment = for your salvation! God is present!
- 2. **PROPITIATION** OF CHRIST = for your salvation! sin is dealt with!
- 3. **PRONOUNCEMENT** OF VICTORY = for your salvation! God's justice is met! The Debt is paid!

I. THE <u>PRESENCE OF GOD</u> in judgment (for your salvation) (33)

- A. divine darkness / supernatural darkness. = divine judgment
- B. Joel 2:2; Amos 5:20; Zephaniah 1:15; Psalm 18.9 (cf. Exodus 10:21-29; Rev 16:10-11)

II. THE <u>PROPITIATION OF CHRIST</u> (for your salvation) (34-36)

• Your Christ was FORSAKEN [meditating on Psalms; what carried him thru? Praying, meditating, reflecting on Psalm 22]

Mark 15:33-37 — "The Violence of Calvary: Cursed & Forsaken by God!"

- Your Christ was CURSED [became the curse for us; Gal 3.13]
- Your Christ was SIN-BEARING [bore our sin in his body, 1 Pet 2.24]
- Your Christ was WRATH-ABSORBING [he made him ... to be sin; 2 Cor 5.21]
- Your Christ was ENDURING [he endured the cross; Heb 12.2]

Consider Hell's Torments and Think of What Christ Endured For Your Salvation...

What we need is GOD to save us from GOD! Christ did it!

III. THE <u>PRONOUNCEMENT OF VICTORY</u> (for your salvation) (37)

The **Strength** — Tetelestai (John 19.30 — it is finished)

The Power of the Cross:

This, the pow'r of the cross: Christ became sin for us; Took the blame, bore the wrath— We stand forgiven at the cross.

This, the pow'r of the cross: Son of God—slain for us.

What a love! What a cost! We stand forgiven at the cross.

The Nicene Creed:

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic* and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

*Catholic — meaning universal, worldwide

The Westminster Confession of Faith — *On Christ the Mediator*.

The Lord Jesus undertook this office completely voluntarily. In order to discharge it, he was made under and perfectly fulfilled the law. He was buried and remained under the power of death, but his body did not decay. He will return to judge men and angels at the end of the world.

By his perfect obedience and sacrifice, offered up to God once and for all through the eternal Spirit, the Lord Jesus has completely satisfied the justice of his Father and purchased not only reconciliation but also an everlasting inheritance in the kingdom of heaven for everyone whom the Father has given to him.

Christ ensures with absolute certainty that everyone for whom he purchased redemption actually accepts and receives it. He makes intercession for them, reveals the mysteries of salvation to them in and by the word, and effectively persuades them to believe and obey by his Spirit. He governs their hearts by his word and Spirit and overcomes all their enemies by his almighty power and wisdom in such ways as are most in agreement with his wonderful and unknowable administration of things.
