Sunday

Read Ruth 1-4. **Ask** How does this love story point us to Christ? **Pray** Lord Jesus, thank You for Your amazing love for us!

Monday

Read Ruth 4:13. **Ask** This is the happy ending, yet the story doesn't end here. Why not? **Pray** Lord, thank You for caring for our needs. You're so gracious to us. Praise You!

Tuesday

Read Ruth 4:13-16. **Ask** Why the focus on Naomi? What is God teaching us in this story? **Pray** Lord, You remember us and we so quickly forget You. Help us to consider You in all that we do.

Wednesday

Read Ruth 4:16-22; Matthew 1:1; 2Tim 2:8-13. **Ask** How does Obed's relationship to King David point us to Christ? **Pray** Lord, thank You for faithfully fulfilling Your promises to provide us not just a king, but *the* King to save us from sin and death.

<u>Thursday</u>

Read Ruth 4:17; Psalm 18:46-50. **Ask** Whose descendants would God bless? How does Jesus fit into this? **Pray** Lord, thank You for providing the Son of David who would secure our forgiveness and blessings forever.

Friday

Read Ruth 4:11-12; Acts 10:34-43. **Ask** What was Jesus anointed to do? How does He fulfill the role of King in a way that David never could? **Pray** Lord, we need You as our King. Teach us to joyful submit to Your rule.

Saturday

Read Ruth 4:16-22; Matthew 9:27; 20:30. **Ask** Why did people appeal to Jesus as the "Son of David" and what does that have to do with Naomi's kinsman-redeemer? **Pray** Lord, You are our Redeemer, the One who has purchased us from sin and death. Make us joyful, bold, and passionate in our humble service to You. Free us from striving to save ourselves!
