#### **Honorable Conduct**

1 Peter 2:11-12

Read the text. How do we live "Kingdom Life" in a Fallen World?

### Obstacle #1 - No Sense of Belonging

Read Jeremiah 29:4-7. While this sounds like straight forward advice, it is not so easy. Peter is giving much the same advice.

- 1. In what ways do we "not belong" here?
- 2. How do we handle being "different" or "foreign?"
- 3. What are the dangers to identifying as "aliens?"
- 4. Does this passage teach Christian isolationism?

# Obstacle #2 – Battle of the Flesh

Read Romans 8:5-8. This comes right after Paul writes about his own fleshly battle in chapter 7. How dangerous is the flesh?

Read James 4:1-3. Is this battle just about refraining from action? The Puritans talked about the mortification of the flesh or of sin. Is this "enemy within" as powerful as those without?

# Obstacle #3 – Encountering Slander

A literal rendition of verse 12 includes "that in what they speak against you as evil-doers, being eyewitnesses of good works, they should glorify God..." In other words, when we live a Kingdom Life in this Fallen World with good works to prove it...

- 1. The world should glorify God. However,
- 2. The world will instead slander us and call us evildoers.
  - Give an example of this in today's world.
  - How do we respond (according to Peter)?

Obstacle #4 – Battling the Me-Firsts and the Now Mentality According to verse 12, who gets the glory for our good works? When will this happen?
