- A. The Condemnation of a Judgmental Spirit
 - 1. What Jesus is not condemning:
 - a. He is not forbidding moral judgments concerning right/wrong, truth/error
 - b. He is not forbidding moral judgments about people- 7:6,15
 - Jesus elsewhere- Matt. 5:20, 6:2,5,16; Matt. 15:1ff, 23:1ff.
 - Jesus' Apostles- Gal 1:8-9; Phil. 3:2; Phil. 3:18-19; 1 Thess. 2:14-15; 1 Tim. 1:6-7; Titus 1:12; 2 John 10; 3 John 9
 - Evangelism- Matt. 28:19; Luke 19:10
 - c. He is not forbidding certain judgments made about Christians
 - 1 Cor. 6:5
 - 1 Cor. 5:12
 - 2. What Jesus is condemning: A judgmental, censorious spirit
 - a. Its root is self-righteousness- Luke 18:9-12
 - b. Its nature is often hypocritical- 7:3-4
 - c. Its manner is often harsh, unmerciful, unloving- Luke 6:36-37
 - Titus 3:2; Gal. 6:1; James 3:17
 - d. Its focus is often misguided- Romans 14:1-5,10,13
 - e. Its disposition is often contemptuous- Rom. 14:3,10; Luke 18:11b
 - f. Its authority is presumptuous- 1 Cor. 4:3-3; Rom 14:4
- B. The Motivation to Avoid a Judgmental Spirit
 - 1. We are to be judged- 7:1
 - 2. We set the standard for our own judgment- 7:2
 - 3. We are unfit to judge- 7:3-4
- C. The Correction of a Judgmental Spirit- 7:5
 - 1. Look first at our own sins and faults
 - 2. Look foremost at our own sins and faults
 - 3. Judge most fiercely our own sins and faults
 - 4. Keep focus on the great mercy and grace of God shown to us!
