-NT letters should be read against the backdrop of the book of Acts (1 Thess. 2:14-16 \rightarrow Acts 17:1-8)

I. General Introduction to Acts

- -Title/Author: The Acts of Jesus Christ / the Holy Spirit through the Apostles; Luke, companion of Paul; physician; author of Luke/Acts (Luke 1:1-4; Acts 1:1; 16:10-17; 20:5-21:18; 27:1-28:16; Col. 4:14; 2 Tim. 4:11; Philemon 24)
- -Date: ~ AD 63
- -Purpose: provide a record of the spread of the gospel and the founding/growth of the church throughout the Roman Empire with attendant mounting opposition to the gospel during the first three decades after Christ's death, resurrection, and ascension
- -Structure:
- I. The Apostolic Witness in Jerusalem (chs. 1-7)
- II. The Apostolic Witness in Judea and Samaria (chs. 8-12)
- III. The Apostolic Witness to Points Beyond (chs. 13-28)

III. Prominent People and Themes in Acts

-People: Peter (chs. 1-12, 15); John (chs. 1, 3, 4, 8); James, the son of Zebedee, one of the twelve (chs. 1, 12); James, the brother of the Lord (not the son of Alphaeus mentioned in 1:13) (chs. 15, 21); Paul (chs. 7-9, 11-28); Stephen (chs. 6-8); Philip (not one of the twelve mentioned in 1:13) (chs. 6, 8); Barnabas (chs. 4, 9, 11-15); Timothy (chs. 16-20); Silas (chs. 15-18); Apollos (chs. 18, 19); Luke (chs. 16, 21, 27, 28); Cornelius (ch. 10); Felix and Festus (chs. 23-26); Herod Agrippa I (ch. 12); Herod Agrippa II (chs. 25, 26).

-Themes:

- •The Holy Spirit: Pentecost (the advent of the Spirit); personality (5:3, 32 8:29 10:19 11:12 13:2 15:28 16:6 20:23, 28 21:11), deity (5:4; 28:25), activity (4:8, 31; 8:39; 11:12; 13:2, 4; 16:6-8)
