Study of John / John 10:22–42

Introduction: The Winter Feast. (22-23)

The Feast of Dedication was not a holiday that God had ordained in Scripture, but it was a celebration that the Jews had created. Antiochus Epiphanies desecrated the Jewish Temple in 168 BC. Some three years later, Judas Maccabeus and his army took the Temple back under Jewish control and reconsecrated it for the worship of God. This festival was observed in December. Today it is celebrated as Hanukkah.
