"Judah and Tamar"

Genesis 38

Introduction

Genesis 37:26-28, 31-35

Big Idea: When he had done even more evil than his fathers, Judah was arrested by God's sovereign grace.

- I. The Account in This Text
 - a. Judah turns aside to the Canaanites. (verses 1–5)

Genesis 3:6; 6:1–2; 34:1–2

- b. Judah delays and ignores Tamar's rights. (verses 6–11)
- c. Tamar manipulates Judah's depravity to get justice. (verses 12–23)
- d. Judah is caught in his hypocrisy toward Tamar. (verses 24–26)
- e. God's surprising plan is again revealed in the birth of twins. (verses 27–30)

 - a. Abhor your treachery against God's grace.
 - b. Surrender your self-righteous hypocrisy.
