- a. Long Life
  - b. Wealth
  - c. Honor
- II. **The summary of having a heart like God**
- a. David, a regular guy – anyone can have a heart like God. God has a plan for all of our lives.
  - b. David, a servant – God made us just the way he wanted us. Our job is to be obedient to His word and His will for our life.
  - c. Facing the giants – Focus on God’s power & purpose, do right, trust God not ourselves.
  - d. Handling people God’s way – Focus on my actions, do right in all situations, God has a purpose, let God deal with others.
  - e. David walks with God – Sensitive to sin, passionate for God, willingly obedient – daily.
  - f. David’s passion for God’s work – Find where God is at work and join the work. Use the gifts God has given us. Do our best.
  - g. How do I overcome sin – understand the process of sin, confess & forsake sin. Remember God loves us more than we can love ourselves. He wants to forgive us.
