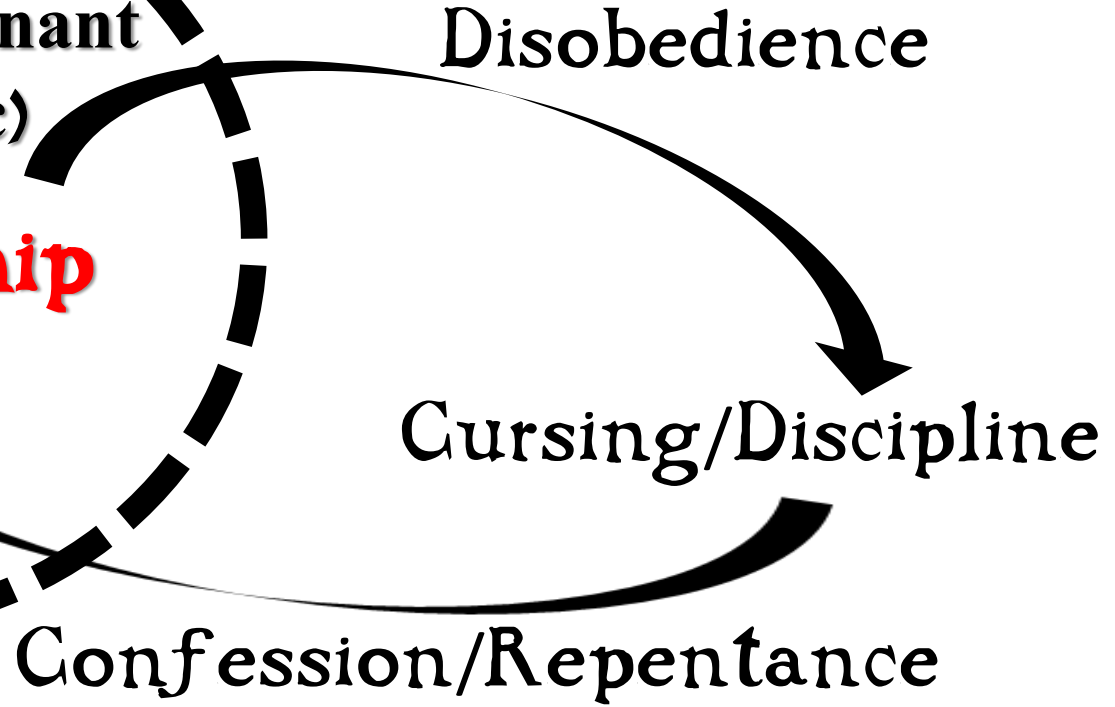
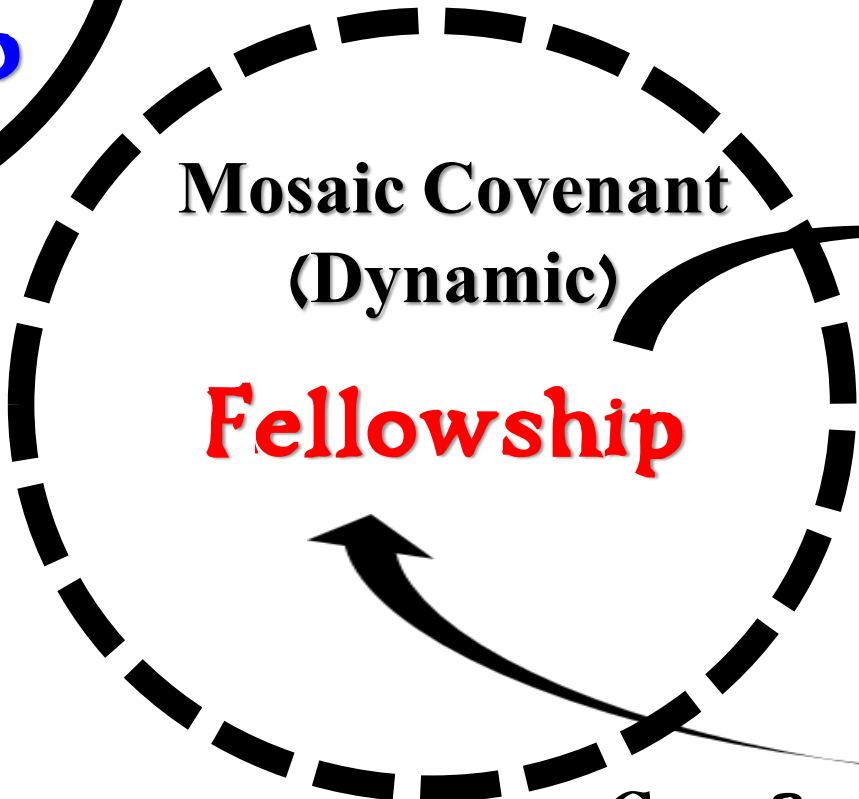
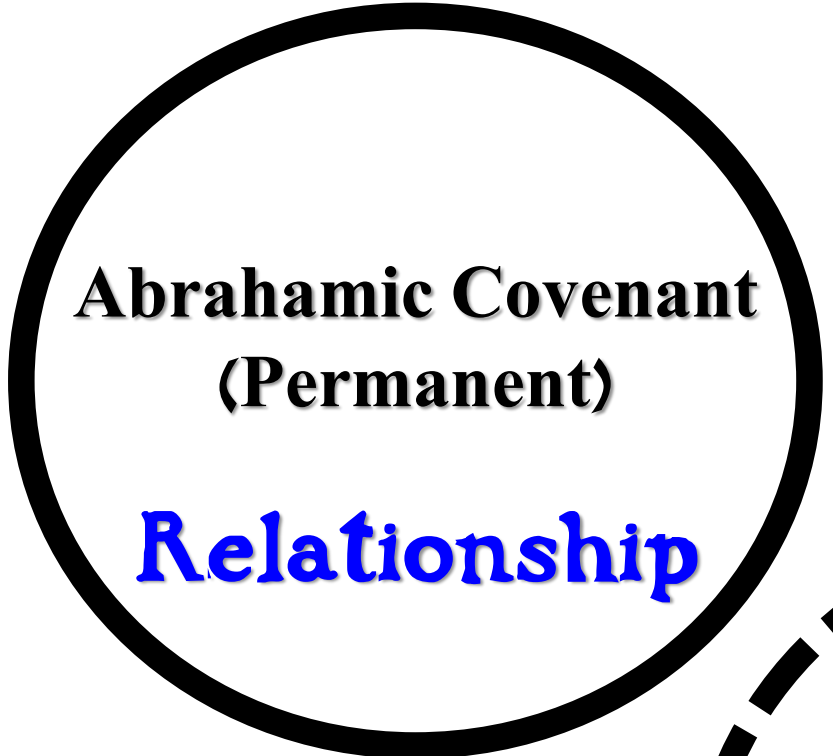


The Mosaic Covenant

Five Degrees of Divine Discipline

Leviticus 26

1- DISTRESS 14-17

2- DROUGHT 18-20

3- DREAD 21-22

4- DISEASE 23-26

5- DISPERSION THROUGH DEVASTATION 27-39

The promise of RESTORATION, on the condition of National REPENTANCE 40-45

“But if you do not obey Me, and do not observe all these commandments, and if you despise My statutes, or if your soul abhors My judgments, so that you do not perform all My commandments, but break My covenant, I also will do this to you: I will even appoint terror over you, wasting disease and fever which shall consume the eyes and cause sorrow of heart. And you shall sow your seed in vain, for your enemies shall eat it. I will set My face against you, and you shall be defeated by your enemies. Those who hate you shall reign over you, and you shall flee when no one pursues you.”

(Leviticus 26: 14–17, NKJV)

Jeremiah 31: 35–37 (NKJV)

35 Thus says the LORD, Who gives the sun for a light by day, The ordinances of the moon and the stars for a light by night, Who disturbs the sea, And its waves roar (The LORD of hosts is His name): 36 “If those ordinances depart From before Me, says the LORD, Then the seed of Israel shall also cease From being a nation before Me forever.” 37 Thus says the LORD: “If heaven above can be measured, And the foundations of the earth searched out beneath, I will also cast off all the seed of Israel For all that they have done, says the LORD.

Joel 3:18–20 (NKJV)

18 And it will come to pass in that day That the mountains shall drip with new wine, The hills shall flow with milk, And all the brooks of Judah shall be flooded with water; A fountain shall flow from the house of the LORD And water the Valley of Acacias. 19 “Egypt shall be a desolation, And Edom a desolate wilderness, Because of violence against the people of Judah, For they have shed innocent blood in their land. 20 But Judah shall abide forever, And Jerusalem from generation to generation.

3- Highlight Joel 3: 18-20:

10 Results of the Judgment of Nations and Deliverance of Israel:

1. The mountains shall drip new wine
2. The hills shall flow with milk
3. The brooks of Judah shall be flooded with water
4. The fountain shall flow from the house of the LORD and water the Valley of Acacias
5. Egypt will be a desolation
6. Edom will be a desolate wilderness
7. Judah will abide forever
8. Jerusalem will be from generation to generation
9. Justice will be made
10. The LORD will dwell in Zion
