# Surely, He Has Borne our Griefs (Isaiah 52:13-53:6)

- Prophet Isaiah under inspiration in his prophecy proclaims the Gospel
- Isaiah 53 is one of the clearest pictures from Isaiah of the suffering Christ

# I. Who is this Servant?

- a. It cannot be Israel of the prophet Isaiah (vv.4,5)
- b. It is Jesus the Messiah (v.5 1 Peter 2: 24; 1: 10, 11)

#### II. Five Aspects or Perspectives Isaiah Sees and Prophesies

# 1. Rebellious Creatures

• Isa 53:1 "who has believed our report" v6 "All like sheep are gone astray"

# 2. Rejected Servant

• v 2 'tender root' 'no comeliness' 'no beauty that we should desire Him'

### 3. Ransoming Substitute

- V 4a surely, He has borne our griefs & sorrows
- V 5 "wounded for our transgression" v 6 "laid on the iniquity of us all"

# 4. Restored Sight

- Isaiah 52:15 "kings will shut their mouths... they will see"
- Paul preached Christ; the eyes of the Gentiles were opened (Acts 26: 18)
- Isaiah 52:13 "Behold my servant shall deal prudently or prosper"

#### 5. Kings will Silently Stand in Awe and Revere Him

- All the nations of the earth and the rulers of the earth will see Him
- He shall be extolled and exalted very High (Phil 2:6-11)
