It seems that Judaizers were attacking these Christians, and the letter seeks to avert the danger.</p> <p>The authorship of this letter has been debated through the centuries, though its original readers knew who it was. 13:18-25 mentioning as it does, Timothy, reminds us of Paul. Some of the style and theology point the same direction. But would Paul the eyewitness apostle have said 2:3?
